

Entry Deadline:

Entries must be made online on or before October 8, 2024 of the current year for all livestock entries. A late entry fee can be made online on or before October 15, 2023. See division rules for any associated fees. There are no refunds of entry fees. All phone conversations are informative only and are not to be considered binding in any litigation or entry acceptance. **Only online entries will be accepted with credit card payments at www. livestockexpo.org.**

Application for Entry: Phone entries <u>will not</u> be accepted. Credit cards (VISA, Master Card, Discover, or American Express) will be accepted for fee payments. All entries will receive acknowledgments.

NOTE: Entry fees do not dictate stall space. Exhibitors will only receive one cattle stall for every animal delivered to the North American International Livestock Exposition, regardless of the number of entries made for the show. A cow/calf pair is considered one entry, but the exhibitor is given two (2) stall spaces for the unit.

Application for Entry: All applications for entry must be made from our web site. Phone entries WILL NOT be accepted. Credit cards (VISA, Master Card, Discover or American Express) will be accepted for fee payments. All entries will receive acknowledgments.

NOTE: Entry fees do not dictate stall space. Exhibitors will only receive one cattle stall for every animal delivered to the North American, regardless of the number of entries made for the show. A cow/calf pair is considered as one entry; but the exhibitor is given two (2) stall spaces for the unit.

All Beef Sale animals are required to pay an entry fee in the show. Sale animals entered but not showing in the open show will be released after each sale is completed. Sale cattle will not be permitted in the tie-outs unless special permission is given by the management. Other cattle will <u>not</u> be permitted in the tie-outs until after 6:00 p.m. Failure to have cattle on display in the buildings will result in forfeiture of premiums won and further disciplinary action by the Executive Committee, such as refusing to accept future entries.

Feed and Bedding: You may bring your own feed and bedding <u>for your entries only or</u> obtain it from our supplier. No other vendors of feed or bedding will be permitted on the grounds. Large square bales are permitted for first bedding, but thereafter, bedding must be stored in a trailer. No Kentucky Exposition Center (KEC) employees are permitted to move large bales. A one-day supply may be brought in each day from a trailer.

All **bulk orders of feed** or any type of **bulk bedding** must be coordinated and made in advance with the official supplier for the NAILE.

Dumping of truckloads of sand, sawdust, shavings, or tan bark will not be permitted in bulk in the barn. Baled shavings or wood chips and straw will be permitted and will be available from the official feed supplier or can be brought from home for your entries only.

Storage of large quantities of feed and bedding in the building will not be permitted. The definition of "large" quantities shall be at the discretion of NAILE or KEC employees. Extra feed and bedding must be kept in your trucks and trailers in the assigned parking area.

Show management is NOT required or expected to provide exhibitors stall space prior to dates and times listed in Premium Book.

ATTENTION:

All exhibitors and visitors are required to adhere to all Kentucky Exposition Center and Kentucky State Fire Marshall policies, rules and/or regulations. A copy is available upon request.

NAILE GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are requested to familiarize themselves with all the rules of this show applicable to their exhibits.

Violation of Rules

Rule 1. All entries for exhibits of any kind or character in this animal exhibit are subject to these regulations and any violation will subject exhibitors to any penalties the Executive Committee may order.

Rule 2. The Exposition reserves to the General Manager and the Executive Committee the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions or differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of, or incident to, the show.

Ownership of Animals

Rule 3. All breeding animals in the purebred classes must have been owned by the exhibitor as of October 1st. All Junior Show animals are required to be owned by and shown by the individual in whose name it is entered. (See the specific show for other rules and required dates.)

Accepting Entries

Rule 4. The show management reserves the right to accept or reject entirely, partially or conditionally any entry or application. The management also reserves the right to personally, or appoint a committee to, inspect all entries after they have arrived, and dismiss any entries that would discredit the Exposition.

Erroneous Entries

Rule 5. Animals that have been erroneously entered may be transferred to their proper class prior to judging, upon application to the General Manager, who will appoint a committee to determine the case. If such classes have been judged, however, they shall not be reopened.

Entry Numbers

Rule 6. Each entry will be assigned a separate number in the official database of the Exposition. This numbered card must be displayed in the harness worn by the attendant when the animal is in the judging ring.

Assignment of Pens and Stalls

Rule 7. The assignment of all the spaces will be made by the superintendent of the breed of the show.

Care of Animals

Rule 8. The exhibitors themselves will be responsible for the delivery of their animals to the appropriate department at the designated times. Exhibitors will be required to attend to their animals while on exhibition and to have them presented to the judges when called. Any exhibitor who fails to present his animals in the ring when the class is called for to be weighed will be barred from the competition.

Appearance of Exhibits

Rule 9. The stalls, pens and exhibition places must be cleaned before 8:00 a.m. each day and all refuse matter disposed of as the superintendent may direct. Exhibitors are required to be neatly dressed when exhibiting stock in the show ring. **Removal of Exhibits**

Rule 10. If you exhibit at this Exposition you will be expected to keep your livestock on the grounds until the published release date of your breed. All animals (except those shown) consigned to the various sales can be released immediately after the sale by obtaining a release slip from the General Superintendent's Office. (Anyone removing livestock from the grounds without show management approval is subject to forfeiture of all premium money.) Repeat violators will be subject to further action by the Executive Committee.

Releases

Rule 11. No livestock (for exhibit or sale) will be released until the exhibitor presents a paid feed bill and veterinarian bill then obtains a release form from the Livestock Superintendent's Office. Fraudulent or unauthorized releases will NOT be tolerated and the penalty may be a permanent ban by the Executive Committee on all exhibitors involved.

Refusal to Parade in Shows

Rule 12. Livestock parades are a great educational feature of this show. Exhibitors refusing, for any cause not meeting with the approval of the management, to lead out their animals for parade or for competition in the show ring when called by superintendents in charge, will not only forfeit all prizes previously won but may be barred from further participation in the show.

Conduct

Rule 13. False representation, interference, or discourteous conduct by an exhibitor will be dealt with by the Executive Committee according to the equities of the case.

Substitutions

Rule 14. Substitutions will be accepted for animals within class only. Substitutions can be made only in the name of the original exhibitor/recorded owner as listed in the entry catalog. Breed shows without defined classes can substitute only an animal of the same sex with a birth date within 60 days of the entry being substituted for.

Judges

Judges are requested to be familiar with all the rules and regulations of this Exposition and to especially know the rules bearing on the classes they will be judging.

Unworthy Exhibits

Rule 15. The Judges will not award prizes to any unworthy exhibit. Animals must be shown in such a manner as the judges require and if the exhibitors refuse to submit to the requirements of the judges, their animals will be dismissed.

Time of Judging

Rule 16. All animals must be exhibited before the judge in the show ring, with catalog number attached and cannot be awarded a prize while still in its stall or pen.

Decision of the Judges Final

Rule 17. The decision of the judges shall be final in all classes except where mistake, fraud, misrepresentation or collusion not discovered at the time of the award is proven. In such case, the General Manager, or such referee or committee as may be appointed, may make decisions; or at its discretion the cases may be appealed to the Executive Committee from whose decisions there can be no appeal.

Awarding of Premiums

Rule 18. Only two premiums per recorded owner can be awarded in any one class.

Awarding of Champion Prizes

Rule 19. In all Championship classes both a Champion and a Reserve Champion shall be selected. Only first place animals will be allowed to compete for championships. Second place winners in class from which the champion was selected are eligible to compete for Reserve Champion.

Premiums

Colored Ribbons

Rule 20. Premiums will be designated by ribbons: Blue, first; Red, second; White, third; Pink, fourth; Yellow, fifth; Dark Green, sixth; Light Green, seventh; Tan, eighth; Brown, ninth; Gray, tenth and over; Champions, Royal Purple; Reserve Champions, Lavender.

Paying Awards

Rule 21. Premiums will be forwarded to the exhibitors as they may direct, as soon after the close of the Exposition as they can properly be processed. Cash premiums are payable by bank check. All premiums whatsoever, not claimed by November 1 of the following year, shall be deemed forfeited to the management or donors.

Special Premiums

Rule 22. All special premiums will be awarded by the judge after judging the regular awards. The Exposition is not responsible for the payment of special premiums but they are all offered in good faith and should be paid promptly.

Protests

Rule 23. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$500 which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must be delivered to the General Manager within six hours after the occasion of such protest, or if age is brought into question, one day, prior to the day on which the animals are to be judged. Protests will be considered by the Executive Committee as quickly as possible and their decision in the matter shall be final.

Rule 24. Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show.

Required Performance Data

Rule 25. In order to emphasize the use of, as well as, the need for performance data in beef cattle production, the following procedure will be maintained for all beef cattle shows at NAILE. All animals will be weighed prior to entering the show ring. Each class will be called for separately to be weighed approximately one class prior to entering show ring. The total weight, as well as, the weight per day of age will be recorded on a card and placed in the exhibitor's harness.

ALL ANIMALS WILL ENTER THE SHOW RING ACCORDING TO AGE AS DIRECTED BY THE BREED SUPERINTENDENT.

Nurse Cows

Rule 26. NURSE COWS: Nurse cows are not permitted at the NAILE; only cows nursing their natural calves and which are entered in the show in the Cow/Calf Class, Senior

Yearling or Junior Yearling Heifer Classes are permitted.

Miscellaneous Rules and Regulations

Rule 27. It is mandatory that all exhibitors cooperate with Judging Contests officials in providing animals for use in the various judging contests.

Rule 28. All group entries are to be made at the show when entries are checked.

Rule 29. In the Beef Department, no more than one fan (overhead preferred) per three head of cattle will be allowed. No fans will be allowed in the aisles. Also, no portable generators are allowed in the building.

Rule 30. Breed registration: An animal is eligible to enter or compete in the North American in only one breed classification regardless if the animal is registered with one or more breed associations or registries. Percentage animals with more than one set of registration papers must be exhibited as entered on original entry form. Percentage animals must be exhibited in the same Open and Junior Breed Show. No switching between breeds will be allowed. Furthermore, the animal must be registered in the recognized U.S. registry for their breed classification or if registered in country of origin outside the U.S., the animal must be eligible for registry in the recognized U.S. registry. No changes will be permitted after a breed is designated.

Rule 31. Dogs will NOT be permitted on the grounds of the Kentucky Exposition Center during the course of the North American International Livestock Exposition except those under leash control of the owner. Any dog running free will be impounded and removed from the grounds.

Rule 32. Any publications or lists prepared by the NAILE management are to be informative only and are NOT to be considered as legal documents of title or ownership.

Rule 33. If any damage, loss or injury to person or property shall be caused by reason of any neglect or willful act of any person, firm, or corporation, or their agents, representatives, servants, or employees having license or privilege to exhibit, or occupy any space on the North American International Livestock Exposition grounds, the North American International Livestock Exposition shall, in no manner, be responsible therefore, and in case it be subjected to any expense or liability, all persons causing same, or liable therefore, shall indemnify the NORTH AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL LIVESTOCK EXPOSITION.

Rule 34. All transit animals will require identification, health papers, and bill of sale to be on the grounds and must obtain a release from the Division of Animal Health before leaving grounds. 840 EID

Rule 35. Aerosol spray cans are banned from the show ring and make up ring.

Rule 36. Health papers will be checked on all livestock before they enter the buildings. Please have health papers with your animals and watch for signage with instructions.

NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the North American International Livestock Exposition. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- 1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- 2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- 3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain, free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the

animal, is prohibited.

- The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
- 7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
- 8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- 9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
- 10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.
- 11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

Dairy Cattle Health Inforamtion

All Dairy Cattle will be required to have a USDA 840 EID Tag. This includes all transit and sale cattle.

All cattle shall be reported negative on an ELISA or PCR BVD-PI test that has been collected by an accredited veterinarian. The results and date of the test shall be recorded on the CVI issued for entry onto the KEC for the NAILE.

OPEN DAIRY SUPREME CHAMPION SHOW

At the completion of the final Open Dairy Breed Show, on Monday, November 11, a Supreme Champion Cow will be selected from all Breed Champions. \$2,000.00 and a banner will be awarded to the Supreme Champion Cow of the Open Show. The Reserve Supreme Cow will receive a large rosette and \$500.00. Supreme Champion Heifer will receive a banner and will be awarded \$500. The Reserve Supreme Heifer will receive a large rosette and \$250.

DAVID SPARROW HERDSMAN AWARD

to be presented at the Open Supreme Selection

Special prizes will be awarded in the dairy department to the herdsman or caretaker in charge of livestock exhibits. A committee appointed by the management will make inspections during the week to determine those who, in their judgment, make the best record for the period of the show, taking into consideration the following points:

Awards for Dairy: First Place award for each breed presented by North American International Livestock Exposition.

The following PREMIER EXHIBITOR AWARD AND PREMIER BREEDER AWARD will be given for each breed.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR AWARD - This award is to be made to the exhibitor winning the most points on no more than six animals owned and exhibited by himself in the open single classes. No more than one of the six to be bulls. (No limit on number exhibited but award automatically figured on top six animals winning the most points) - BANNER

PREMIER BREEDER AWARD - This award to be made to the breeder on no more than six animals winning the most points in open single class, including animals bred by him but exhibited by others. No more than one of the six to be bulls. (No limit on number exhibited but award automatically figured on top six animals winning the most points) - BANNER

In case of tie on the points system, the exhibitor or breeder winning the most money on the same animals will be awarded the prize. In case of partnership animals, the person that enters the exhibits will receive the points, however, if the animal is entered in a partnership name, then the partnership will receive the total points.

The Point System for determining Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor is as follows:

If there is still a tie on the points system, Grand Champion animals will be given 3 points, Reserve Champion animals 2 points, and Junior, Intermediate or Senior Champions and Reserves will be given 1 point to break the tie.

BEST UDDER AWARD - It is recommended that in each of the milking cow classes the judge selects the 1st and 2nd best uddered cows in each class. This selection shall be made on the basis of udder alone and a milk-out will be at the discretion of the judge. It is recommended that the two cows in each class be given special recognition just prior to the final placing of their respective class. The best uddered cows from each of the classes will not compete for an overall best udder award of the show.

Garland Bastin - North American International Livestock Exposition Scholarship Award

Garland Bastin served as the NAILE General Superintendent for 27 years, from the show's founding until his death in 2000. He was an individual with the highest integrity who truly loved young people. He believed that exhibitors of animals at livestock shows should at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment should reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity. The NAILE Executive Committee is proud to offer a **\$1,000** scholarship in memory of this extraordinary man.

Scholarship Rules:

- To be eligible you shall be a high school senior during the current school year.
- To be eligible you shall exhibit at least one animal in the NAILE Junior Dairy Show in the year that you apply for the award.
- To be eligible you shall be available for the award presentation during the NAILE Junior Supreme Dairy Show.

The application will be judged by a panel of livestock industry professionals. Judges' decision is final.

The application will be judged on the following basis:

35% — Academic and achievements

30% — Involvement with dairy cattle 35% — Essav

Payment of the scholarship will be made upon proof of acceptance for enrollment in a college or other institute of higher learning. Payment will be made directly to the recipient. The scholarship is only available for payment within a 24 month period after it has been presented.

GENERAL DAIRY RULES

1. ALL ENTRIES SHALL BE MADE IN NAME SHOWN ON REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE. EACH ANIMAL SHOULD BE ENTERED OVER THE INTERNET. NOTE: It is recommended that exhibitor and breeder be defined as follows: "Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family, residing on one farm and when the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor for Premier Exhibitor, Premier Breeder, Dairy Herd, Junior Best Three Females, Breeder's Get-of-Sire, State Herd, and Best Three Female Classes. An animal owned by any person in the 'Herd Unit' may be substituted for one owned by any other person in the 'Herd Unit'."

Animals owned in partnership or by syndicate may be shown in the name of the partnership or syndicate only; except that at time of entry a determination shall be made that such animals will be shown in the name of one partner or syndicate member; and the animals shall be shown the same way in the group classes, as they are in the open single classes.

Applications for entries in the cattle department shall be filled in on the internet, giving the name of the recorded owner, animal's name, number and date of birth and the name and number of the sire and dam of the animal to be exhibited. GROUP CLASS ENTRIES WILL BE MADE AT TIME PAPERS ARE CHECKED.

Any applications or lists prepared by the NAILE management are to be informative only and are NOT to be considered as legal documents of title or ownership.

- 2. Each exhibitor will be required to present certificate of registration for his entries when called upon by the Superintendent in charge.
- 3. All entries shall be animals recorded in the American or foreign herd books for the particular breed to which they belong.
- 4. Showmanship classes: The age of the junior exhibitor is determined by January 1 of the current year. The animal used in showmanship shall have been shown in the individual classes by the same exhibitor.
- 5. The drinking of alcohol by minors is prohibited per ABC guidelines and KEC policy.
- 6. The North American International Livestock Exposition will provide large, portable containers for disposal of manure and trash. These vehicles will be parked at various locations throughout livestock buildings at all times. When receptacles are full, they will be replaced by other receptacles. The area where receptacles sit should be clear at all times; no bedding or manure is to be heaped into this area at any time. Manure and trash must be put into the above containers for removal.
- All exhibitors are limited to winning two premiums and two ribbons in each class and only one premium in group classes. EXCEPTION - Get-of-Sire where gets are by two different sires. Produce of Dam where produce is from two different dams.
- 8. Protest (See NAILE General Rules).
- 10. The Exposition Management would appreciate the courtesy of all cattle exhibitors if they remove all female cattle from the barns when they freshen and not return these animals to exhibition barns until they are thoroughly clean. This is only fair to the public and other exhibitors in that it removes any possible nuisance.

- 11. Substitutions: Substitutions are allowed in the same class with the same recorded owner or herd unit. In addition, two open substitution (out of class) will be allowed per herd unit of the same breed. Once an animal has been substituted in either the Junior or Open Shows, the original animal entered shall be eliminated from any further competition.
- 13. Red & White Dairy Cattle are eligible to enter and compete in only one breed classification, regardless, if the animal is registered with one or more breed associations or registries. Animals shall be exhibited as entered on original entry form. Switching between breeds will not be allowed. Animals shall be shown in the same breed for both the Open and Junior Dairy Show.
- 14. Health Regulations (See NAILE General Rules).
- 15. ALL ANIMALS SHALL BE RECORDED IN THE OWNER'S NAME PRIOR TO THE OPEN SHOW. TRANSFERS OF ANIMALS Shall BE COMPLETED BY AT LEAST 1 HOUR PRIOR TO THE OPEN BREED SHOW. ALL JUNIOR OWNED ANIMALS Shall FOLLOW REGISTRATION AND TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS PERTAINING TO DATES IN THE RULES OF THE VARIOUS JUNIOR SHOWS.
- 16. Any dairy cattle sale animals can be entered in the open show after their breed sale (within 1 hour) in the name of the new recorded owner only. The normal (\$45.00) entry fee will be required. They shall remain until the other show cattle are released if they are shown.
- 17. All (ADA) reasonable accommodation requests will be addressed in the order that they are received and can be sent directly to naile@kyvenues.com. Requests shall be sent no later than 5:00pm EST the day before the exhibitor plans to show.
- 18. The moving of stall assignments by exhibitors is NOT allowed. Violators will be subject to further action by NAILE staff.
- 19. All animals in production classes are subject to ultrasound testing and milk sample testing. The testing is pursuant to Kentucky Law KRS 246 dealing with unethical practices used in regard to livestock and the criminal penalties involved. In order to maintain the integrity of the exhibition and presentation of dairy animals, the NAILE will continue a testing program at this year's Expo. Animals may be required to be ultrasounded and milk samples taken if deemed necessary by show officials. Failure to follow the request of show officials may cause disqualification of all of the exhibitor's entries.
- 20. All champions and reserve animals will be ultrasounded and milk samples taken. This includes, but is not limited to breed champions, the Jersey Jug Futurity Champions, Supreme Champion, and any other animal if deemed necessary by show officials.

21. NO BARBED OR PRONGED HALTERS ALLOWED.

- 22. Dairy animals shall have a permanent identification and this permanent identification shall match the animal identification on the animal health papers. All Dairy Cattle shall have a USDA approved premise 840 EID tag
- 23. Water Tanks- Cattle are to be watered in the exhibitor's stall area only.
- 24. Herd Units will be allowed 2 wild card substitutions per breed.

BEDDING

Storage of large quantities of feed and bedding in the building will NOT be permitted. Extra feed and bedding shall be kept in trucks and trailers in the assigned parking area. Truckloads of sand, sawdust, shavings or tan bark will not be permitted to dump in bulk in the barn. Baled shavings or wood chips and straw will be permitted and will be available from the official feed supplier or can be brought from home for your entries only.

LARGE BALES ARE PERMITTED FOR FIRST BEDDING, BUT THEREAFTER IT SHALL BE STORED IN A TRAILER. NO KEC EMPLOYEES ARE PERMITTED TO MOVE LARGE BALES. A ONE DAY SUPPLY OF HAY OR STRAW MAY BE BROUGHT INTO THE BARN EACH DAY.

NAILE MILKOUT PROCEDURE

- 1. The call for a milkout can be a breed association rule; or a judge's request; or the Ethics Committee; or a NAILE management request.
- 2. The announcement for a milkout shall be made while the cows are still in the show ring.
- 3. The cows shall be escorted from the show ring to the milking parlor by a representative selected by the breed association. Any identification problems on a cow will be resolved by a breed association representative.
- 4. All cows shall be taken directly to the KEC milking parlor and checked by the official veterinarian. The use of an individual's portable milker shall take place in the milking parlor or location designated by KEC.
- 5. The procedures for sampling the milk will be supervised by the Kentucky Milk Safety inspectors. The NAILE official veterinarian will be responsible for witnessing the milkout of each cow and can inspect the milk and udders before, during, and after the milkout.
- 6. When cows are returned to the show ring, they shall be escorted directly from the milking parlor to the show ring. The NAILE official veterinarian will be available if the judge requests a consultation.
- 7. The only provision for photographs will be those taken in the show ring during the award presentations.
- 8. The definition of a milkout would be the removal of all milk in the udder comparable to the normal daily management practices of a dairy cow.
- All violators of the PDCA show ring code of ethics will follow the guidelines stated in the PDCA Enforcement Procedures previously listed. A Milk Safety inspector will be available for assistance if requested.

*The Jersey Jug Milkout will follow the American Jersey Cattle Association Milkout rules.

The Purebred Dairy Cattle Association SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS (Adopted by PDCA May 5, 2015)

The showing of registered dairy cattle stimulates and sustains interest in the breeding of registered dairy cattle. It is also an important part of the promotion, merchandising and breeding program of many breeders. For these reasons, the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association (PDCA) believes that it is in the best interest of all breeders of registered dairy cattle to maintain a reputation of integrity in dairy cattle shows and to present a wholesome and progressive image of dairy cattle in the show ring.

PDCA endorses this Show Ring Code of Ethics for all dairy breed shows and pledges its full cooperative support for its enforcement to show management, show judges, and the national breed associations.

The application of this Code of Ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this Code of Ethics. Dairy cattle exhibitors shall, at all times, deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship.

It is recognized that there are certain practices in the proper care and management of dairy cattle that are necessary in the course of moving dairy cattle to and between shows that are advisable to keep them in a sound, healthy state so they might be presented in the show ring in a natural, normal condition. At all times, exhibition livestock shall be treated in a humane manner and in accordance with dairy quality assurance practices so as to protect the health, safety and welfare of the livestock and the consuming public. No person shall present for exhibition or exhibit an animal which he or she knows, or has reason to suspect, is affected with or has been exposed to a dangerously contagious or infectious disease, or illegal or non-approved use of drugs, medication and/or prohibited substance, or residue.

The position of the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association is that all animals presented for exhibition shall be in their natural conformation and structure, free of any alteration or modification by injection or internal or external administration of any substance or by any involvement in unethical fitting.

Grooming and Preparation

Dairy cattle exhibitions are conducted under standards for evaluating conformation established by the PDCA *Unified Score Card* (1994), with specific breed characteristics taken into consideration by the show judge. In this connection, animals will be groomed and prepared for the judge's evaluation in order to display the animal's natural contour, conformation, performance and mobility. Specifically:

- 1. Changing the natural color of the animal is prohibited. However, external applications of cosmetics that affect only appearance may be used, including by way of example hoof polishes and false switches.
- 2. The maximum allowable length of naturally growing hair anywhere on the topline is not to exceed 1". (See Holstein rules concerning hair length) Exhibitors will be required to comply with this rule before the animal is allowed to enter the ring.
- 3. Addition of foreign objects, including but not limited to hair or hair substitutes, cloth or fiber, to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body is prohibited.

4. Externally sealing the teat end with a preparation that does not harm the animal's skin is permissible. Natural teat placement will be given preference over artificially positioned teats.

Violations: False, Deceptive or Unacceptable Practices

These practices are violations of the Code of Ethics and will be reported to show management and may be reported to the respective national breed associations:

- 1. Misrepresenting the age and/or milking status of the animal for the class in which it is shown.
- 2. Treating the animal, particularly the udder, internally or externally:
 - a. with an irritant or counter-irritant,
 - b. using a device to artificially create or enhance the udder crease,
 - c. using other substances as detected by testing that causes changes in the udder to artificially improve the conformation.
 - d. plugging of teat canal with foreign substances.
- 3. Surgical or unethical insertion of any matter under the skin or into body cavities, performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body (e.g., administration of fluid via a stomach tube or other similar apparatus to fill the rumen), though not to preclude practices required or involved in normal management.
- Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring or other conduct detrimental to the breed or the show.
- 5. Challenging, threatening or interfering with an ethics committee appointed by show management to monitor the animals on exhibit on the show grounds.

Exhibitor Responsibility

The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter and/or absolutely responsible person (hereinafter referred to as "Exhibitor") for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, milk, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Materials may also be collected by ultrasound and photographic methods and by direct examination of animal.

The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter and/ or absolutely responsible person (the "Exhibitor") to have disciplinary action for violation of this Show Ring Code of Ethics taken by show management, the state in which the show occurs, and/or the national dairy breed association without recourse.

Show Ethics Committee

Each show should have an Ethics Committee. The make-up of this committee should include official breed representatives, representative(s) of show management (e.g., dairy cattle show superintendent, General Manager), the official show veterinarian, and Extension representative.

The Ethics Committee will be responsible for monitoring violations of the Show Ring Code of Ethics. The Ethics Committee will investigate the report of any violation and determine the accuracy of the allegation. The Ethics Committee will have the authority to inspect animals and related material to determine if violations have occurred.

Violations: Reporting and Investigation

Before An Animal is Shown

If the Ethics Committee suspects that a violation of the Show Ring Code of Ethics will occur if the animal is shown, and that violation is reasonably well established before the animal is shown, the Ethics Committee will submit a report to show management.

Show management will discuss the violation with the Exhibitor:

- 1. If, at the Exhibitor's discretion, the animal in question is not shown, no violation will have occurred.
- 2. If the Exhibitor wishes to challenge that a violation occurred, he/she/they will have opportunity to appeal to the Ethics Committee. If its decision is not changed, the Exhibitor will be denied opportunity to exhibit the animal in question.

During and After An Animal is Shown

All animals are subject to examination during judging. The judge and Ethics Committee are instructed to examine the top five (5) animals in each class closely for violations of the Show Ring Code of Ethics. When a violation may have occurred, a milkout may be called for. This call may be by breed association rule, or by request of an authorized representative of the national breed association, the judge, the Ethics Committee, or show management.

If an animal is exhibited and a violation of the Show Ring Code of Ethics is subsequently suspected, investigated, and determined to have occurred, the violation will be reported to the Ethics Committee and show management for action. The Exhibitor will be notified of the violation and the supporting evidence and invited to defend or explain the allegations.

Violations are subject to the disciplinary provisions of show management, the state in which the show occurs, and the national dairy breed association. Sanctions may include any one, or combination of the following:

- forfeiture or return of awards, prizes, premiums or proceeds;
- written letter of reprimand to the owner, exhibitor, fitter and/or absolutely responsible person (the "Exhibitor");
- disqualification of the exhibition livestock from an exhibition;
- disqualification of the Exhibitor from the show;
- publication of offense.

Disqualification may include any or all shows and classes and may be for any number of years.

History: Adopted by PDCA in March 1969, revised March 1971, February 1977, February 1981, February 1986, February 1988, February 1989, February 1992, February 1993, November 1995, April 2002; April 2004.

The North American International Livestock Exposition Board has approved the above code provided it is enforced by a committee, including official show veterinarian, and provided the rules are enforced in such a manner they do not preclude normal, needed veterinary care.

MILKING PARLOR

THE NORTH AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL LIVESTOCK EXPOSITION WILL HAVE A MILKING PARLOR FOR THE CONVENIENCE OF THE DAIRY EXHIBITORS AND EVERYONE IS WELCOME TO USE IT. ANY EXHIBITOR WISHING TO BRING A PORTABLE MILKING STAND FOR THEIR OWN USE, SHALL ALSO BRING MILK CANS.

- 1. ALL milk from each exhibitor's cattle will be tested for the presence of antibiotics at each milking.
- 2. All bulk tanks will be tested for antibiotics prior to delivery to a processing plant. Tanks of milk found to contain antibiotics shall be disposed of.
- 3. Any exhibitor found offering milk for sale containing antibiotics or other unacceptable milk may be penalized.
- 4. The North American International Livestock Exposition Executive Committee may bar repeat or chronic violators from participating in the Exposition.

To qualify for Bred and Owned awards, one of the original owners shall be listed as one of the current owners.

The Guernsey Gold Futurity will be shown Sunday, November 10 at 7:30 a.m.

General Rules

The Futurity is for three-year-old cows born from September 1, 2020 through August 31, 2021. To be eligible for entry into the show, all four payments (\$3, \$5, \$10, \$25) shall have been received by the American Guernsey Association (AGA) by the appropriate deadline. The fourth payment of \$35.00 shall be sent to the AGA by October 15, 2024. The AGA board of directors is at all times the governing body of this Futurity. All matters pertaining to the showing of this Futurity are subject to the rules and regulations of the NAILE.

Premier Points

The first and second-place winners will compete for the NGS-Louisville Intermediate Champion and will qualify for premier breeder, exhibitor and sire points. The remaining entries will not qualify for premier points in the Guernsey Gold Futurity, but will be allowed to show in the NGS-Louisville if proper entry has been made. If the first- or second-place animal is shown in the NGS-Louisville three-year-old cow class, then the premier points earned in the Guernsey Gold Futurity shall be forfeited. The premier points would then result from the animal's placing in the NGS-Louisville three-year-old cow class.

Premiums

The money collected from entry fees minus expenses will be given to exhibitors showing in the Guernsey Gold Futurity. The breakdown of premiums is as follows:

1st - 15%, 2nd - 12.5%, 3rd - 10%, 4th - 7.5%, 5th thru 10th - 5%, 11th thru 25th - Remainder of pot divided equally to these finishers but not to exceed the premium paid to higher-placing finishers. These figures are subject to change depending upon number shown.

- 1. Eligibility for Participation Any boy or girl who meets the following qualifications is eligible to participate:
 - a. Age is limited to boys and girls who are at least 8 and younger than 21 on January 1 of this calendar year.
 - b. The participant shall be an AGA Junior member and the recorded owner of one or more registered Guernsey Females, properly recorded in the Herd Register of the American Guernsey Association or a respective National Guernsey Association or a participant in the American Guernsey Association Youth Lease Agreement Program.
 - c. The qualifying record of ownership or lease for animals, other than those bred by the junior exhibitor, shall be determined by the actual date the application for transfer of ownership was received in the office of the American Guernsey Association. This date is automatically stamped on the back of the registration certificate and will be found with the transfer of ownership data. The qualifying dates are:

In classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 and 19, the date of sale stamped on the registration certificate shall be prior to August 1, 2024.

- d. In all classes the recorded ownership shall show in the sole ownership of the exhibitor or partnership comprised of only junior members or be a participant in the American Guernsey Association Youth Lease Agreement Program.
- e. If the participant is exhibiting under the American Guernsey Association Youth Lease Agreement Program, all guidelines and terms shall have been followed and a copy of the signed and dated agreement shall be present.
- 2. Frequency of Participation Any boy or girl who meets eligibility to participate may exhibit in as many years as his or her eligibility will permit.

- a. Each eligible exhibitor is limited to two entries in any one class and is eligible to show in each class.

Show Rules

- All animals shall have registration papers in the exhibitor's name or a photostatic copy of valid papers in process for registration or transfer (to be collected by the superintendent and forwarded to Holstein Association USA) to be eligible to show. No animal will be checked into the books without this proper identification.
- 2. Animals owned in partnership or by syndicate may be shown in the name of the partnership or syndicate only; except that at time of entry a determination shall be made that such animals will be shown in the name of one partner or syndicate member and the animals shall be shown the same way in the group classes, as they are in the open single classes.

The judge will name the first and second best udder in each milking class. First and second place ribbons will be presented

Exhibitors competing for the Grand Champion have the option to milk out their cows before the Grand Champion class. If they choose to milk out; the exhibitor shall go thru the ultrasound and milk test procedures FIRST.

I. THE PUREBRED DAIRY CATTLE ASSOCIATION SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS Adopted May 5, 2015

- The showing of registered dairy cattle stimulates and sustains interest in the breeding of registered dairy cattle. It is also an important part of the promotion, merchandising and breeding program of many breeders. For these reasons, the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association (PDCA) believes that it is in the best interest of all breeders of registered dairy cattle to maintain a reputation of integrity in dairy cattle shows and to present a wholesome and progressive image of dairy cattle in the show ring.
- PDCA endorses this Show Ring Code of Ethics for all dairy breed shows and pledges its full cooperative support for its enforcement to show management, show judges, and the national breed associations.
- The application of this Code of Ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this Code of Ethics. Dairy cattle exhibitors shall, at all times, deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship.
- It is recognized that there are certain practices in the proper care and management of dairy cattle that are necessary in the course of moving dairy cattle to and between shows that are advisable to keep them in a sound, healthy state so they might be presented

in the show ring in a natural, normal condition. At all times, exhibition livestock shall be treated in a humane manner and in accordance with dairy quality

assurance practices so as to protect the health, safety and welfare of the livestock and the consuming public. No person shall present for exhibition or exhibit an animal which he or she knows, or has reason to suspect, is affected with or has been exposed to a dangerously contagious or infectious disease, or illegal or nonapproved use of drugs, medication and/or prohibited substance, or residue.

The position of the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association is that all animals presented for exhibition shall be in their natural conformation and structure, free of any alteration or modification by injection or internal or external administration of any substance or by any involvement in unethical fitting.

Grooming and Preparation

- Dairy cattle exhibitions are conducted under standards for evaluating conformation established by the PDCA Unified Score Card (2009), with specific breed characteristics taken into consideration by the show judge. In this connection, animals will be groomed and prepared for the judge's evaluation in order to display the animal's natural contour, conformation, performance and mobility. Specifically:
- 1. Changing the natural color of the animal is prohibited (effective 6/1/2015). However, external applications of cosmetics that affect only appearance may be used, including by way of example hoof polishes and false switches.
- 2. The maximum allowable length of naturally growing hair anywhere on the topline is not to exceed 1" (Holstein guidelines will allow up to 1½"). Exhibitors will be required to comply with this rule before the animal is allowed to enter the ring.
- Addition of foreign objects, including but not limited to hair or hair substitutes, cloth or fiber, to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body is prohibited.
- 4. Externally sealing the teat end with a preparation that does not harm the animal's skin is permissible. Natural teat placement will be given preference over artificially positioned teats.

Violations: False, Deceptive or Unacceptable Practices

These practices are violations of the Code of Ethics and will be reported to show management and may be reported to the respective national breed associations:

- 1. Misrepresenting the age and/or milking status of the animal for the class in which it is shown.
- 2. Treating the animal, particularly the udder, internally or externally:
 - with an irritant or counter-irritant,
 - using a device to artificially create or enhance the udder crease,
 - using other substances as detected by testing that causes changes in the udder to artificially improve the conformation.
 - plugging of teat canal with foreign substances.
- 3. Surgical or unethical insertion of any matter under the skin or into body cavities, performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body (e.g., administration of fluid via a stomach tube or other similar apparatus to fill the rumen), though not to preclude practices required or involved in normal management.
- 4. Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring or other conduct detrimental to the breed or the show.
- 5. Challenging, threatening or interfering with an ethics committee appointed by show management to monitor the animals on exhibit on the show grounds.

Exhibitor Responsibility

- The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter and/or absolutely responsible person (hereinafter referred to as "Exhibitor") for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, milk, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Materials may also be collected by ultrasound and photographic methods and by direct examination of animal.
- The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter and/ or absolutely responsible person (the "Exhibitor") to have disciplinary action for violation of this Show Ring Code of Ethics taken by show management, the state in which the show occurs, and/or the national dairy breed association without recourse.

Show Ethics Committee

- Each show should have an Ethics Committee. The make-up of this committee should include official breed representatives, representative(s) of show management (e.g., dairy cattle show superintendent, General Manager), the official show veterinarian, and Extension representative.
- The Ethics Committee will be responsible for monitoring violations of the Show Ring Code of Ethics. The Ethics Committee will investigate the report of any violation and determine the accuracy of the allegation. The Ethics Committee will have the authority to inspect animals and related material to determine if violations have occurred.

Violations: Reporting and Investigation

Complaints of alleged violations can be reported to the breed superintendent, the show superintendent, show management, and/or the Ethics Committee.

BEFORE AN ANIMAL IS SHOWN

If the Ethics Committee suspects that a violation of the Show Ring Code of Ethics will occur if the animal is shown, and that violation is reasonably well established before the animal is shown, the Ethics Committee will submit a report to show management.

Show management will discuss the violation with the exhibitor:

- 1. If, at the exhibitor's discretion, the animal in question is not shown, no violation will have occurred.
- 2. If the exhibitor wishes to challenge that a violation occurred, he/she/they will have opportunity to appeal to the Ethics Committee. If its decision is not changed, the Exhibitor will be denied opportunity to exhibit the animal in question.

DURING AND AFTER AN ANIMAL IS SHOWN

- All animals are subject to examination during judging. The judge and Ethics Committee are instructed to examine the top five (5) animals in each class closely for violations of the Show Ring Code of Ethics. When a violation may have occurred, a milkout may be called for. This call may be by breed association rule, or by request of an authorized representative of the national breed association, the judge, the Ethics Committee, or show management.
- If an animal is exhibited and a violation of the Show Ring Code of Ethics is subsequently suspected, investigated, and determined to have occurred, the violation will be reported to the Ethics Committee and show management for action. The exhibitor

will be notified of the violation and the supporting evidence and invited to defend or explain the allegations.

- Violations are subject to the disciplinary provisions of show management, the state in which the show occurs, and the national dairy breed association. Sanctions may include any one, or combination of the following:
- forfeiture or return of awards, prizes, premiums or proceeds;
- written letter of reprimand to the owner, exhibitor, fitter and/or absolutely responsible person (the "exhibitor");
- disqualification of the exhibition livestock from an exhibition;
- disqualification of the exhibitor from the show;
- publication of offense.

Disqualification may include any or all shows and classes and may be for any number of years

II. CLASS RULES

The following class rules are to be followed at all National Holstein Shows:

A. Only animals of 87% Registered Holstein Ancestry or higher will be eligible.

B. Bred and Owned Recognition Rules

To be considered for Bred & Owned awards, one of the original owners shall be listed as one of the current owners. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as exhibits of one breeder.

Note: Please refer to the Junior Holstein Showring Policy, Rule F, for the definition of Bred and Owned for Junior Shows.

C. Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor Rules

1. Premier Breeder

The owner of the dam at the time of service shall be considered the breeder of the animal. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family, and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as exhibits of one breeder. Otherwise, when animals are bred in partnership, each unique partnership is considered a unique breeder.

The exhibitor winning the most points (for a maximum of six animals exhibited in the open single classes by him/herself and/or other exhibitors) shall be designated the Premier Breeder. In classes with ten or less animals, no more than two head per breeder will be counted toward premier points.

2. Premier Exhibitor

The exhibitor shall be the owner. In case a herd is registered or bred in the names of different members of a family, residing on one farm or breeding establishment, and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor for all group classes. However, members of one family, where cattle are not housed as one unit, will not be considered as a single exhibitor. When animals are owned in partnership, each unique partnership is considered a unique exhibitor. The exhibitor winning the most points (for a maximum of six animals which he/ she owns and exhibits in the open single classes) shall be designated the Premier Exhibitor. In classes with ten or less animals, no more than two head per breeder will be counted toward premier points.

D. Group Class Rules

1. Junior Best Three & Best Three Females

Entries in the group classes shall be entered and shown in their individual animal classes. All shall be bred by the exhibitor and at least one animal shall be owned (solely or in partnership) by the exhibitor.

Breeder is identified as listed on the registration paper. Where animals are bred by different members of a family, and where the herd is one unit, they are considered as bred by one breeder. When animals are bred in partnership, each partnership is considered a unique breeder.

In keeping with the basic philosophy of the Holstein Association USA, ethics are an individual responsibility of the owner of each animal shown. Violations of these policies are subject to the disciplinary provisions of the Association Bylaws. Amended November 2017

JUNIOR HOLSTEIN SHOWRING POLICY

- A. Eligibility: Exhibitors shall be a minimum of nine years old, by the date of the show, to participate, but not have reached their 21st birthday by January 1 in the year competing. Members who become 21 years of age during the current year will be allowed to compete in Junior activities until December 31st of the current year and not beyond that time. Exhibitors shall be National Junior Members of the Holstein Association USA.
- **B.** Entries: All animals shall be registered by Holstein Association USA. The Junior Owner(s) or lease shall be recorded on the registration certificate.

Animals shall have a minimum of 87% Registered Holstein Ancestry (RHA) to be eligible for the designated shows.

C. Ownership: Animal must be registered in the name of the Junior member, or a partnership of Junior members, throughout the year exhibiting in order to qualify for Junior recognition. Adult-Junior and family or farm partnerships are not acceptable.

For an animal (cow or heifer) being transferred to a Junior, or a partnership of Juniors, the transfer application must be recieved by the Holstein Association USA office on or before July 15th by 11:59 pm Eastern Time

*Canadian owned animals must be dually registered in Canada and the U.S. Animals must be transferred in Canada prior to transferring in the U.S. Transfers in the U.S. must still be made by 11:59 pm Eastern time.

The following actions will disqualify an animal from Junior recognition:

- Transferring an animal in or out of a Junior's name after July 15 of the show year
- · Adding or dropping any adult or Junior member as an owner after the deadline
- **D.** Lease: The Junior leasing program is designed to encourage young people to get involved in a dairy project and learn about animal care and responsibility. The leased animal remains in the original ownership and, if the leased animal is bred, any offspring are named using the owner's prefix.

1. The leasing program is not available to youth who concurrently own any Registered Holsteins either as an individual or in partnership. However, if the lessee becomes the owner of the animal anytime during the year exhibiting, they will qualify for junior recognition.

2. A maximum of two Registered Holsteins may be leased by any youth at one time. Animals may not be leased by partnerships.

3. The lease may be terminated by either the owner (lessor) or the youth (lessee) by providing written notice to the other party 45 or more days before the

intended termination date. A Lease Termination Report shall be filed with Holstein Association USA. If the animal has been sold, submitting an application for transfer of ownership will also terminate the lease.

4. The animal shall be leased before she reaches her first birthday.

5. Leased animals may only be shown by the lessee (Junior). If a leased animal is shown by an adult, the lease is automatically terminated. The leasing Junior shall show the animal at all shows; no substitutions may be made.

6. The owner of an animal to be leased shall submit the Certificate of Registration for that animal and a completed Application for Transfer, with the "Lease" box marked, to Holstein Association USA, Inc. All lease applications shall be received by June 1 in the year exhibiting.

7. The fee to lease an animal is \$20. There is no fee to record a lease termination.

8. When a lease is initiated and approved, the Certificate of Registration will be printed with the lease details and mailed to the Junior lessee. When a lease is terminated and the Certificate of Registration is returned to Holstein Association USA, the lease termination will be recorded on the certificate and the certificate will be mailed to the owner. All leases expire on December 31 of the year in which the junior lessee becomes 21 years of age if not terminated prior to that date.

- E. Exhibition: To be eligible to compete at National Shows, entries shall be shown by the Junior owner in all cases, except by prior written approval. Alternate Leadsperson forms shall be submitted to the Holstein Youth Program Specialist by 5:00 p.m. the day before the show. If approved, another National Junior Holstein member the same age or younger than said exhibitor shall show the animal. Adults are not allowed to show, in any case, or assist with the Junior State Herd Class. A leased animal may only be shown by the Junior lessee.
- F. Bred & Owned: To be eligible for Junior Bred & Owned, the name(s) listed as breeder and owner on the registration certificate shall be the same. Adult-Junior partnerships are not acceptable. Family unit or farm partnerships will not qualify for Bred & Owned awards unless all partners are Junior members and listed on the certificate under breeder and owner.
- **G. Partnership:** All animals shall stand on the Association records in the individual name of the exhibitor. Adult-Junior partnerships will not be acceptable. Family or farm partnerships are not acceptable unless all members are Junior members and listed on the registration paper. The only acceptable partnership will consist of two or more Junior members. In case of partnership animals, all owners shall not exceed 21 years of age as of January 1 of the participating year.
- **H.** Violations: If any of the above Junior Show Ring Policy is violated, all Junior exhibitors involved will lose all privileges for that show the following year.

The winner is NOT eligible to show in her class in the Open Show. The breeder of the Winner earns first-place senior female points

for calculation of the Premier Breeder Award. The Recorded Owner (exhibitor) for the Futurity Winner ears first-place senior female points for calculation of the Premier Exhibitor Award, even if ownership changes before the Open Show.

Reserve Winner: The second-place cow (Reserve Winner) qualifies for her respective champion class in the All American Jersey Show. If a junior three-year-old she will be eligible for the Intermediate Champion class or will be eligible for the Senior Champion class if a senior three-year-old. She will be awarded second-place senior female points for Premier Breeder and Exhibitor as described above. However, this cow has the option of being shown in her class in The All American Jersey Show. She will not be eligible for the champion class unless she places first or second in her age class in the open show, and will earn Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor points ONLY for the open show placing.

All premiums will be paid directly to the exhibitors by the North American International Livestock Exposition. The AJCA Youth Program, supported by proceeds of the National Heifer Sale, will provide an additional \$5,000.00 to be divided equally among junior exhibitors and paid directly to them by the American Jersey Cattle Association.

Eligibility

Rule 1. Exhibitors. Exhibitors shall be no younger than nine (9) and no older than 20 years of age as of January 1, 2024. U.S. residents shall be members (junior or lifetime) of the American Jersey Cattle Association.

Rule 2. Entries. Animals are eligible when recorded by the American Jersey Cattle Association in the Herd Register or with Generation Count 4 or greater, or by Jersey Canada with registry status of 93.75% and greater.

The exhibitor shall be listed as Recorded Owner on the registration certificate, either (1) as the sole owner or (2) by his/her name in joint ownership. If the joint ownership includes more than one person meeting the eligibility requirements of Rule 1 (above), one of them shall be declared as the exhibitor during check-in.

Animals shall be registered and/or transferred to meet one of the above ownership requirements on or before August 1, 2024. The date of registration and/or transfer is the Date Recorded printed on the registration certificate.

Rule 3. Participation. Entries shall be shown by the exhibitor, except by prior written approval from NAILE. Alternate leadspersons shall (1) be associated with the Herd Unit and also eligible to show by age (Rule 1, above), or (2) if not, be the same age or younger than the exhibitor of the animal being shown. Requests for alternate leadsperson shall be

submitted for approval by the NAILE dairy show superintendent on forms provided by the AJCA no later than 12:00 noon the day before the show.

No more than two (2) animals may be shown by one exhibitor in any one class. The exhibitor shall lead the first entry and the second entry shall be led by an NAILE approved alternate leadsperson.

Adults are not allowed to show in any case.

Rule 4. Breeder Status. In order to qualify for Premier Breeder points and Best Bred and Owned awards, the exhibitor declared at check-in shall have his/her name recorded as a Breeder on the animal's registration certificate. These awards will be made only to the individual exhibitor in the case of partnership animals.

Entry forms for Premier Junior Breeder and Premier Junior Exhibitor will distributed at check-in. Submit forms by 6:00 p.m. on the day prior to the show at the AJCA booth.

Rule 5. Substitutions. Substitutions are allowed within the same class by the same Recorded Owner. In addition, one out-of-class substitution will be allowed per junior exhibitor. Once a Jersey animal has been substituted in either the Junior or Open show, the animal originally entered shall be eliminated from any further competition.

Photographs

Rule 6. Exhibitors of the first and second place winners of each class are required to provide, at their expense, a professional photograph of the animal taken during the current show season to the *Jersey Journal* no later than December 1.

Statement on Ethics

Participants in The All American Junior Jersey Show, including but not limited to owners, exhibitors, fitters and absolutely responsible persons, are cautioned to read, fully understand, and comply with all of the following:

- (1) Laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky;
- (2) Rules and Regulations of the North American International Livestock Exposition;
- (3) Rules and procedures specific to the NAILE Dairy Show; and
- (4) The PDCA Show Ring Code of Ethics (revised May, 2015).

Testing or inspection of any and all animals entered in The All American Junior Jersey Show may be conducted by the General Manager of the North American International Livestock Exposition or designated agent before, during or after the competition.

Any milk-outs during the show, whether in individual classes or the championship classes, will be at the discretion of the judge, the All American Executive Committee and/or the AJCA Board of Directors.

Cows are ranked on a 100-point scale based on three different measurements: (1) placing rank in class (50 points), (2) rank for genetic merit as measured by AJCA Jersey Performance Index (25 points), and (3) rank for production, as measured by USDA Yield Deviation (25 points). RULES

Eligibility to Purchase

Animals in the Pot O'Gold Sale can only be purchased by juniors between the ages of 7 and 20 (inclusive) on January 1 of the sale year, who reside in the United States or Canada. A junior may purchase only one Pot O' Gold calf per contest year.

Related or unrelated youth may purchase an animal to be transferred to them in partnership. A junior may not purchase an animal consigned by a member of his or her immediate family.

Loss, death or transfer of ownership of any purchase before the record is complete will eliminate the heifer and owner(s) from the Pot O'Gold Production Contest.

Production Contest

Seventeen percent (17%) of the gross sales will be set aside in a Pot O'Gold Fund. This fund will provide cash awards for the owners of the 22 calves that complete the highest records ranked by total product value.

Testing Requirements

All heifers shall be tested in a DHI herd owned by the purchaser, or the purchaser's parent(s) or legal guardian(s). In the event this is not possible, a written request to test the heifer in another herd shall be made to the All American Executive Committee by December 31 of the year the heifer is purchased. In any case, the heifer cannot be tested in the herd(s) owned by her breeder and/or consignor.

DHI records will be confirmed by files obtained from the Council on Dairy Cattle Breeding (CDCB). If completed in Canada, records shall be a form of test recognized by the American Jersey Cattle Association (AJCA) or Jersey Canada.

Eligible Records

Records shall be submitted to the American Jersey Cattle Association no later than July 1 of the contest year. Only first-lactation records are accepted, provided the heifer calves before 30 months of age.

Records shall have a minimum Data Collection Rating (DCR) of 90 to qualify.

Rankings are determined by adjusting the records for age and month of calving using USDA regional factors (305-day, 2x, m.e.) provided by Council on Dairy Cattle Breeding, then applying FMMO protein, butterfat and other solids values for the previous calendar year (e.g., 2023 for 2024 production contest), plus a weighted average PPD.

- All NAILE Rules and Regulations and General Rules of the Dairy Cattle Department apply.
- All exhibitors will be required to wear show harnesses while exhibiting their animals.
- The judge will name best udder in each milking class.
- Any animal sold or exhibited (including but not limited to class winners, Champion, and Reserve Champion) as registered by the American Milking Shorthorn Society can be blood/DNA typed at the discretion of the Executive Secretary or AMSS Representative. AMSS Policy as of June 2022, states all champions and reserve champions will be DNA and/or Genomics tested, with all expenses to be paid by AMSS.

Eligibility

Animals eligible to show at the national show level in the United States and Canada are eligible to exhibit. All United States animals shall be registered in the full herdbook of and have registry certificates issued by the American Milking Shorthorn Society. The certificate shall be white and shall not have the words "Not eligible to show" printed near the Executive Secretary or AMSS Representative signature or as a watermark across the page. Animals with a prefix of GI, GI2, GR, and GE are not eligible to be shown. Females with a 36000 or 37000 registration number are not eligible to be shown. Tattoo numbers, fair tags, and/or RFID tags shall correspond with the registry certificates. All Canadian animals shall be registered in the Canadian Milking Shorthorn Society official herdbook, be 75% purity or greater, and be true to breed standard for Milking Shorthorn type and color. Any Milking Shorthorn with black hair cannot be shown unless released by the AMSS Executive Secretary or AMSS Representative.

Specific Rules of Eligibility

- 1. To be eligible to be shown, a Milking Shorthorn base hair color shall be red, white, or roan (red and white intermixed). No other base color is allowed.
- 2. Disqualifications for color beyond rule 1 above include animals that are brindled with diffuse black hairs on locations other than the edge of the ear, edge of the muzzle, or nape of the shoulder, or animals that have more than one location with black hair on other parts of the body.
- 3. "Black Hair" for purpose of these rules refers to hair that is black the entire length of the shaft to the root.
- 4. Minimal black hair described as "ticking" around the edge of the ears, edge of the muzzle, and shoulder nape is permissible.
- 5. An animal is eligible to be shown if it has no more than one "spot" of black hair smaller than four square inches.
- 6. "Black Spot" refers to areas of solid black hair or areas of black roan with diffuse white or red hairs intermixed.
- 7. Measurement is made around the distinct edge of the area in question.
- 8. If an animal has one spot larger than four square inches, or more than one spot, it is ineligible to be shown.
- 9. Any animal with one spot smaller than four square inches that is to be shown shall be blood/DNA typed for parental identification. If parental ID is

confirmed, the animal is eligible thereafter for all show and national awards.

- Any animal the Executive Secretary or AMSS Representative examines and finds to have one or multiple black spots, regardless of eligibility for showing, is required to be blood/DNA typed for parental identification to maintain registry status.
- 11. As there exists a lack of uniformity in varying show venues across the country in response to enforcement of the Black Hair Rule, the Board of AMSS has stipulated the following: only the Executive Secretary of the American Milking Shorthorn Society or AMSS Representative shall have authority in determining eligibility of animals under the Black Hair Rule. The Executive Secretary or AMSS Representative is required to be in attendance at all accredited national shows.
- 12. When the Executive Secretary of the American Milking Shorthorn Society or AMSS Representative is in attendance at a national show, or if she/he is at any other venue in which Milking Shorthorns are being exhibited as registered cattle in the AMSS Herd Book, she/he may, at their discretion, or at the request of either the owner of an animal or other exhibitor, examine an animal for eligibility due to the above color requirements or other considerations.
- 13. If the Executive Secretary or AMSS Representative is requested by a party other than the owner to examine an animal for any reason, the person requesting the examination shall first post a \$150 nonrefundable fee with the Executive Secretary or AMSS Representative.

Breeder - The breeder of the animal shall be the name of the person, farm, or partnership, as it appears on the registry certificate (owner of dam at time of service). Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of an immediate family (grand/parents, spouse, siblings, grand/children), but the prefix remains the same, all entries may be considered as exhibits of one breeder. When animals are bred in partnership or syndicates, each unique entity is considered a unique breeder.

Bred and Owned - To be eligible for Bred & Owned awards, one of the breeders shall be listed as one of the current owners. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of an immediate family (grand/parents, spouse, siblings, grand/children), and the one of those members is an owner, that entry may be considered as Bred and Owned. If a breeder was part of a partnership and remains as an owner then the animal is considered Bred and Owned.

Exhibitor - The exhibitor shall be an owner of the animal and appear on the registry certificate. Where a herd is registered or bred in the names of different members of an immediate family (grand/parents, spouse, siblings, grand/children), and where Herd Unit requirements are met, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor. When animals are owned in partnership or syndicate, each unique entity is considered a unique exhibitor.

Herd Unit - If a herd is registered in the names of different members of an immediate family (grand/parents, spouse, siblings, grand/children), of the herd owner, these persons may be considered one breeder/exhibitor. To be considered part of the Herd Unit all animals shall be: A) Housed in the same location (same premise ID). B) Under the exclusive care and management of the herd owner. C) Health tested and production tested with the owner's herd - All animals listed on the same forms with the same herd code.

D) When the "Herd Unit" option is elected, all animals owned and exhibited by any member of the unit shall be shown under the "Herd Unit" entry - A list of names of all individuals owning animals included in the "Herd Unit" and the name of the "herd Unit" shall be submitted with the application for entry and will be considered as one exhibitor throughout the show.

Partner or syndicate owned animals are not included under a Herd Unit.

Any uncertainty, or dispute, with the above definitions should be addressed with the AMSS Executive Secretary (or AMSS Representative present at the show) prior to the show. Their decision will be final.

Show Rules

- 1. Eligibility: Participation in this show is open to youth with registered Milking Shorthorns. Exhibitors shall be a minimum of nine years old but not have reached their 21st birthday by January 1st in the year competing. Members who become 21 years of age during the current year will be allowed to compete in Junior activities until December 31st of the current year. Youth shall be a member of the American Milking Shorthorn Junior Society by August 1st of the current year. If the youth is not a member by August 1st, they shall join before the show by paying the \$25 junior membership fee and an additional \$5 penalty to become a junior member payable to the American Milking Shorthorn Junior Society and turned into the AMSS Executive Secretary. Juniors are expected to follow the PDCA showmanship scorecard for all National Junior Shows.
- 2. Registration: All animals shall be registered in the full herdbook of the American Milking Shorthorn Society and have registry certificates issued by the American Milking Shorthorn Society. The certificate should be white and does not have the word "Not eligible to show" near the Executive Secretary's signature or as a watermark across the page. Animals with a prefix of GI, GI2, GR and GE are not eligible to be shown. Females with a 36000 or 37000 registration number are not eligible to be shown. Tattoo numbers, Fair Tags and/or RFID tags shall correspond with the registry certificates. Registration papers will be checked at the show by show management.
- 3. Ownership: Ownership of the animal shall be recorded in AMSS herdbook in the name of the junior exhibitor(s) by August 1st of the current year. Animals may be owned in partnerships, however all members of the partnership shall be paid junior members of AMSJS and animal shall be owned by August 1st. Acceptable wording of Farm or other entity should read: Junior member's name of Farm name or other entity (EX: Nicholas Achen of Cherrywood Farm). The following will disqualify an animal from Junior show participation and recognition in current year: Transferring an animal in or out of a Junior's name after August 1st of the show year or adding/ dropping a junior member and/or adult as an owner after the deadline.
- 4. Lease: Animals that are leased through the American Milking Shorthorn Junior Society Lease Program are also eligible to be shown by juniors. Leases shall be on file with the

AMSS office by August 1st of the current year. Lessee shall be a paid American Milking Shorthorn Junior Member. The Junior who leases the animal shall show her. Only one AMSJS Junior Member may appear on each individual lease per animal. Multiple juniors are not permitted to lease the same animal. Alternate leadsperson are

not permitted for leased animals except for an unforeseen circumstance.

- 5. Participation: Up to two animals may be exhibited by each exhibitor in any one class. One animal shall be shown by an owner listed on the registration certificate who is a paid National Junior Member. The second animal may be shown if the alternate leadsperson form is completed. All rules for the alternate leadsperson form apply. A Junior can own multiple animals in a given class, but only two may be exhibited. Additional animals shall be leased by another Junior or if animal is owned in a partnership, the animals can be exhibited by another member of the partnership.
- 6. Alternate Leadsperson: The Junior who owns the animal is to show her. If the owner cannot attend the show, an Alternate Leadsperson shall be a National Milking Shorthorn Junior member, who is the same age or younger or up to three years older than the owner OR who is a sibling (full, half, step, foster) of the owner. All Alternate Leadspersons shall meet the age guidelines of a minimum of nine years old but not have reached their 21st birthday by January 1st in the year competing. Alternate Leadsperson may show the animal with approval of the Executive Secretary or board appointed delegate known as the "Breed Representative." A Request for Alternate Leadsperson form shall be submitted to the AMSS Executive Secretary by email to Executive-Secretary@milkingshorthorn.com or hand delivered by five o'clock (5 p.m.) the day before the show to either the Executive Secretary or Breed Representative. Requests shall be submitted by this time or the animal is ineligible to show, unless there is an unforeseen circumstance. The owner of the animal is to show at least on national qualifying Junior show, to receive Junior All American recognition. The Request for Alternate Leadsperson form is available at www. milkingshorthorn.com or from show management. The only exception to this rule is for an alternate leadsperson for showing/leading in the Champion Classes (Junior, Intermediate, Senior and/or Grand). Alternate Leadsperson in the champion classes shall meet junior age guideline but does not have to be a National Milking Shorthorn Junior member.
- 7. Bred & Owned: As of January 1, 2024, for a junior show animal to be eligible for Junior Bred and Owned one of the breeders shall be listed as one of the current owners. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of an immediate family (grand/parents, spouse, siblings, grand/children), and one of those family members is an owner, that entry may be considered as Bred and Owned. If a breeder was part of a partnership and remains as an owner, then the animal is considered Bred and Owned. All parties listed shall be AMSJS Members. Dairy bloodlines include: Ayshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Holstein (Black & White and Red & White), Jersey, Milking Shorthorn, Angler, Swedish Red, Aussie Red, Lineback and Rouge Flammande.
- The RWDCA will accept registration papers and/or a certificate of identification (CID) from Holstein Association USA. Other registration papers accepted will be from RWDCA, Holstein Association USA showing the suffix "RED" and Holstein Canada.
- 6. LEASE: All animals shall be owned or leased by the junior by **July 1** of the current year. TRANSFER: For an animal (cow or heifer) being transferred to a Junior, or a partnership of Juniors, the transfer application shall be received by the Holstein Association USA office on or before **July 15**. With the exception of animals purchased by and/or leased to a Junior at the RWDCA National Convention.
- OWNERSHIP: Two or more juniors may own an animal. One junior shall be on the halter to receive junior recognition. Awards will be presented as one unit, to all owners equally.
- 8. Entries shall be shown by the Junior owner in all cases, except by prior written approval. - Gate 1 will be open 24/7.
- Health Inspections will be conducted at time of entry at the gates.
- All animals must have a valid Health Paper with Official USDA Identification (including all transit animals).

Rules

1. All entries must be made online at livestockexpo.org. All animals shown in groups must have been shown as individuals. Groups must be declared at check-in, no entry fee.

Requests for late arrival must be in writing; however, all papers must be checked by 12 noon on Friday, November 8, 2024 (NO EXCEPTIONS).

- 2. CANCELLATION NOTICE: Failure to notify the show office of entry cancellation or change may result in further action by show management.
- 3. PEN ASSIGNMENT: PENS WILL BE ASSIGNED BY STATE. EXHIBITORS HAULING OR TAKING CARE OF ANIMALS WILL HAVE PENS BY EACH OTHER. NO OTHER REQUESTS WILL BE HONORED.
- 4. Unless other rules are specified, this show will be held under the rules of the American Dairy Goat Association (ADGA), provided they do not conflict with any of the rules and regulations prescribed by the North American International Livestock Exposition (see pages 17 – 22).
- 5. The Junior and Senior shows are separately sanctioned with the American Dairy Goat Association.
- All dairy goats exhibited must be registered with the American Dairy Goat Association, American Goat Society, or the Canadian Goat Society. The original registration or recording certificate for all animals of all ages is required.
- 7. In all classes, an exhibitor is the owner as evidenced by the name on the registration or recordation certificate. All animals must be owned by exhibitor not less than 30 days prior to the opening of the show. All proof of partnerships must be declared at time of entry, and the partnership name will be used as exhibitor/owner.
- 8. All exhibitors showing animals in individual classes in the ring should wear white show uniforms.
- 9. NO MILKOUT However, overdistended udders will be discriminated against.
- 10. All milk must be disposed of in designated areas. No dumping of milk will be allowed in floor drains or outside.
- 11. No dogs will be allowed.
- 12. All exhibitors must wear an entry number assigned to that doe. Entry numbers will be included in the exhibitor's packet distributed during check-in.
- 13. Parking and camping: See information in front of this book, page 7.
- 14. All exhibitors are responsible for all rules, regulations, and information found in this premium book. Failure to comply with these rules and regulations can lead to expulsion and/or forfeiture of premiums.
- 15. TACK PENS will be available to exhibitors if possible. Animals will be stalled first, and any pens left will be assigned for tack.

General Rules

- 1. To be eligible to exhibit in the Junior Steer Show, the exhibitor must not be more than 21 years of age on January 1 of the current year.
- 2. All animals must be exhibited by the youth in whose name entry is made except in the case of more than one entry per class, in which case a bona fide youth member must exhibit the animal. Exception to this rule (in case of emergency) must have written approval by 8:00 a.m. on the show day by the superintendent.
- 3. The entry deadline for the steer show will be October 8, and there will be an entry fee of \$80.00 per head. The late entry deadline for the steer show will be October 15, and there will be a late entry fee of \$150.00 per head.
- 4. All steers must have a minimum weight of 950 pounds, with no maximum weight.
- 5. Weights will be submitted via QR Code on the exhibitor's backtag that the exhibitor will pick up during check-in. Weights must be turned in via QR Code submission for each Steer by 1:00 p.m., Saturday, November 16. The weight submitted will be the declared show weight of the steer. Scales will be available for the exhibitors' use from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Saturday and 8:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon Sunday. All steers must be checked in (November 16, 9:00 a.m. 12:00 noon) before weights are submitted. By submitting the weight card, the owner/exhibitor agrees to all the NAILE rules and regulations, including ownership and code of ethics. All violations will be reviewed by the Exposition management and/or the Executive Committee.
- 6. There will be no changing of weights after the weights have been submitted.
- 7. Steers will not be shown by breeds. All steers will be divided into classes of not more than approximately 20 head per weight class.
- 8. No more than two premiums per class will be paid to any one exhibitor regard less of the number entered.
- 9. All steers will be released after the show. A cash market may be provided for all steers. NAILE is not responsible for prices paid or issuing checks.
- 10. The top ten placings in each class will receive premium awards and ribbons.
- 11. After each class of steers is placed, only the top ten steers will be weighed on the

official scales in the show ring by show officials. Each steer must be within 4% above or below the declared show weight as previously designated by the exhibitor on the weight card. If any steer is out of its weight range, it is disqualified and the remaining steers move up in placing. The disqualified steer is not eligible for any other class and will not be reweighed. The 1st and 2nd place class winners will be reweighed before the championship class. 1st and 2nd place class winners that are disqualified in the reweigh for the championship class will not be eligible for the champion but will still receive premiums won in the previous individual class.

- 12. All steers will be subject to official veterinarian inspection prior to entering classes or prior to leaving ring after class has been placed.
- After selection of the top five champions, the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion animals become the property of the North American International Livestock Exposition.
- 14. The top five market animals will be drug tested. Random animals may also be selected for drug testing. At time of testing Animal Affidavit Forms will be available to provide information of any medication given that could be inside the withdraw period. For additional rules and information, please refer to the National Code of Show Ring Ethics in the General Rules starting on page 21.
- 15. All Grand and Reserve Champion animals will be processed, and the carcasses and hides of each animal will be inspected and evaluated for tampering. This would include but is not limited to inspection of the carcass and hide for injection sites that do not conform to typical animal husbandry practices. Any animal with an abnormal carcass or hide due to the injection of air or any other substance in order to alter the conformation or appearance of an animal may be subject to disqualification including loss of premiums, prizes, and awards received. Exhibitors may also be banned from future competition.
- 16. All of the General Rules and Regulations for the North American International Livestock Exposition will apply to this show.
- 17. All exhibitors will be required to wear show harnesses while exhibiting their animals.
- 18. All cattle must have a USDA 840 EID tag.
- 19. Health Certificates must be presented at check in.

- 4. No substitutions will be allowed in the Junior Heifer Show.
- 5. All animals exhibited must have been recorded or registered in the exhibitor's

name on or before October 1 of the current year. The October 1 ownership date is determined by the respective breed associations as documented with NAILE show management.

- 6. The exhibitor must comply with all the rules including ownership of the animal and that the rules and regulations of this show have been met both in practice and in intent. Embryos must meet the same ownership requirements as other animals.
- Tattoo verified papers will be accepted at Junior Heifer Check-In. Tattoo verified papers will still be required to be presented during check-in to ensure accuracy of entries. Heifers without tattoo-verified papers will be required to have their tattoos visually inspected by show officials during junior check-in.
- Tattoos will be checked during check-in processing or at the discretion of show officials.
- 9. Any eligible youth in violation of any of the rules of the North American International Livestock Exposition or who has knowingly made an attempt to misrepresent an animal or its registration or who acts in an unbecoming manner shall be disqualified for exhibition at this show, and no premiums shall be paid. Such action shall be taken as deemed necessary by the Youth Committee of the North American International Livestock Exposition.
- 10. All animals must be exhibited by the youth in whose name entry is made except in the case of more than one entry per class, in which case a bona fide youth member must exhibit the animal. Exception to this rule (in case of emergency, e.g., illness verified by doctor complete with telephone and/or fax number) must have written approval by 8:00 a.m. on the show day by the Youth Show Superintendent. Conflicts with school must be requested in writing by November 1 to NAILE with documentation from school officials.
- 11. All entries must be filed with the North American International Livestock Exposition on or before October 15 of the current year. Each exhibitor will be limited to two (2) entries per class.
- 12. Entry fee of \$35.00 must accompany the entry. Youth entries will be allowed to show in the open show with additional entry fee as determined by the breed by October 8.
- Grooming chute fee for the Beef Shows is \$35.00. A tie space is not guaranteed for your grooming chute. Youth are encouraged to share grooming chutes and tack areas.
- 14. Animals exhibited by youth may be brought to the Kentucky Exposition Center on November 14 at 12:00 p.m. thru November 15 by 11:00 a.m. All heifers must be stalled inside the barns by 11:00 a.m. on November 15. See next page for Junior Show Check-In schedule.
- 15. Junior Show heifers may be released from the grounds after their breed champion on November 16 & 17. Released Junior heifers and tack must be removed from stall areas by midnight Sunday, November 17. Junior animals entered in the Open Show will be released with open show cattle.
- 16. Feed and equipment will be the responsibility of each exhibitor. Feed and bedding will be available for purchase in the barn.
- 17. Other Breed classes are open to all duly recorded or registered animals that are not eligible for breed shows provided. Cattle eligible for exhibition in the other breed classes must be duly recorded with a recognized breed association with ownership requirements in accordance with foregoing rules. Heifers that are eligible for another breed show are not eligible for the AOB show. Registered animals with Branham influence should enter in Division 0242 AOB -American Infleenced.
- 18. Heifers of breeds that require specific weights prior to registration (example: adjust-

ed 205 day wt. or adjusted 365 day wt.) must submit a copy of the application for recordation, completed with exception of missing weights if the animal is too young at the time of entry to be weighed and recorded. The above exception does not apply to animals eligible for recordation in their respective breed association.

The American Angus Association[®], 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Mo., will participate in premiums offered in individual classes for junior Angus heifers, as included in its standard show classifications, according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The premium assistance should not be used to offset show expense and shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors.

A minimum of fifteen (15) head must be shown in the Junior Angus heifer classes to receive American Angus Association premium participation. The show is not required to have all classes to be eligible for premiums.

Separate classes for bred and owned heifers may be held if the size of the show merits a separate class.

To be eligible for Association premiums, the entries must be recorded in the sole name of the junior exhibitor, and the issue date on the registration certificate must conform to the individual show's requirements regarding ownership. The Association's contribution is included in the total premiums listed in each class.

Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay on premiums offered in championship classes. An animal may only be counted one time toward the total count for premium participation by the Association.

Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association available for inspection at the show for each animal or another current proof of ownership issued by the American Angus Association pedigree look up. - Animals must be registered or recorded in the Belted Galloway Society Herd Book or other Society recognized Herd Book.
- 4. Animals must be in good physical condition and typical of the breed in conformation. "Good physical condition" shall include but is not limited to the absence of any infectious condition such as ringworm or warts.
- 5. Original registration or recordation will be required at check-in. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be allowed to show.
- 6. Bulls over 12 months of age are required to wear a nose ring, either temporary or permanent, and must have a lead attached to the ring whenever being led.
- All bulls exhibited must have two descended testicles. No cryptorchids will be allowed.
- 8. Bulls exhibited at 16 mos. of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate documenting they have passed a breeding soundness exam, including but not limited to the progressive motility, sperm morphology and scrotal circumference performed by a licensed veterinarian.
- 9. Females that are 26 months or younger are eligible to show in the heifer classes. Females that are 27 months or older must show in the cow/calf class with a calf at side. Calves exhibited in the cow/calf class cannot be over 230 days of age. All cows must be lactating, and all calves must be nursing.
- 10. Animals must be purebred and registered in the Herd Book to qualify for the purebred show. This will include purebred, properly marked heifers, bulls, purebred steers, and purebred mismarked heifers. Mismarked heifers will not be eligible for Supreme Drive.
- 11. 1Percentage Belted Galloway animals must be recorded in the Herd Book to be eligible to be exhibited in the percentage Belted Galloway show, which would include percentage heifers and steers.
- 12. Percentage heifers and steers may not be shown in group classes.
- 13. The order of the show will be purebred, properly marked heifers, cow/calf, bulls, and group classes. Followed by purebred steers, percentage steers, purebred mismarked heifers, and percentage heifers.

Group classes:

- Only purebred Belted Galloway heifers and bulls can be shown in group classes. No percentage animals or purebred steers are allowed.
- All animals shown in group classes must be owned or co-owned by exhibitor at least 30 days prior to the show
- There will only be three group classes, Get of Sire (3 animals by one sire), Produce of Dam (2 animals by one dam), and Best Four Head (4 animals rep resented in any configuration) (All animals shown in the Best Four Head must be owned or co-owned by the exhibitor at least 30 days prior to the show). All animals shown in groups must have shown in previous classes.

- 14. All Grand Champion and Reserve Champion animals shall be DNA verified at the Society's expense.
- 15. To compete in Junior Showmanship classes with an animal, the Exhibitor must be a junior member of the Society and be eight years of age or older. No bulls over seven months of age may be used in showmanship, and any animal deemed unruly or dangerous while in the ring can be dismissed at the judge's discretion. Only one handler per animal will be allowed in the ring during Showmanship.
- 16. Substitution: Should any entry be substituted for another no new fees are required. However, registration papers must be submitted with the request for substitution. Substitutions are required to be made by the late entry deadline of the show. Substitutions may be made within class only.
- 17. The show committee reserves the right to split over-enrolled classes and combine under-enrolled classes.
- 18. The show committee reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include any injection of gas, solid or liquid under the skin to alter conformation, any additions of artificial tail heads or polls, any surgical alteration of the animal's shape, as well as any dyeing or coloring that alters the animal's natural color pattern. Artificially filling animals internally (pumping) is strictly prohibited.
- 19. Exhibitors are responsible for making sure entries are in the staging area before their classes are called. Exhibitors who do not enter the show ring within three minutes of the announcer's final call, forfeit the right to compete in that class.
- 20. Decisions of the judges are final except where mistake, fraud, or misrepresentation is proven. Complaints, if any, must be tendered in writing to the Show committee. Cost of any resultant investigations shall be borne by the complainant if allegations are dismissed, or by the exhibitor against whom the complaint was issued, if allegations are proven correct.
- 21. All protests must be made within 24 hours of the show.
- 22. Interference with or disrespect shown to the judge by any exhibitor during the performance of the judge's duties shall be deemed grounds for immediate disqualification.
- 23. Exhibitors must obey all rules of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc., and the North American International Livestock Exposition or be disqualified. Failure of exhibitors to follow the rules and release times shall result in the exhibitor not being allowed back the next year.
- 24. Exhibitor's timeslots for set up will be communicated to exhibitors.
- 25. Unattended animals must be double-tied with halter rope plus neck rope or two halters, two ropes.

Show Rules

212

- 1. Exhibitors must be members in good standing of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc.
- 2. Animals must be registered or recorded in the Belted Galloway Society Herd Book or other Society recognized Herd Book.
- Animals must be in good physical condition and typical of the breed in conformation. "Good physical condition" shall include but is not limited to the absence of any infectious condition such as ringworm or warts.
- 4. Original registration or recordation will be required at check-in. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be allowed to show.
- 5. Females that are 26 months or younger are eligible to show in the heifer classes. Females that are 27 months or older must show in the cow/calf class with a calf at side. Calves exhibited in the cow/calf class cannot be over 230 days of age. All cows must be lactating, and all calves must be nursing.
- 6. Animals must be purebred and registered in the Herd Book to qualify for the purebred show. This will include purebred, properly marked heifers, bulls, purebred steers, and purebred mismarked heifers. Mismarked heifers will not be eligible for Supreme Drive.
- 7. Percentage Belted Galloway animals must be recorded in the Herd Book to be eligible to be exhibited in the percentage Belted Galloway show, which would include percentage heifers and steers.
- 8. Percentage heifers and steers may not be shown in group classes.
- The order of the show will be purebred, properly marked heifers, cow/calf, bulls, and group classes. Followed by purebred steers, percentage steers, purebred mismarked heifers, and percentage heifers.
- 10. To compete in Junior Showmanship classes with an animal, the Exhibitor must be a junior member of the Society and be eight years of age or older. No bulls over seven months of age may be used in showmanship, and any animal deemed unruly or dangerous while in the ring can be dismissed at the judge's discretion. Only one handler per animal will be allowed in the ring during Showmanship.
- 11. Substitution: Should any entry be substituted for another no new fees are required. However, registration papers must be submitted with the request for substitution. Substitutions are required to be made by the late entry deadline of the show. Substitutions may be made within class only.
- 12. The show committee reserves the right to split over-enrolled classes and combine under-enrolled classes.
- 13. The show committee reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include any injection of gas, solid or liquid under the skin to alter conformation, any additions of artificial tail heads or polls, any surgical alteration of the animal's shape, as well as any dyeing or coloring that alters the animal's natural color pattern. Artificially filling animals internally (pumping) is strictly prohibited.
- 14. Exhibitors are responsible for making sure entries are in the staging area before their classes are called. Exhibitors who do not enter the show ring within three minutes of

the announcer's final call, forfeit the right to compete in that class.

- 15. Decisions of the judges are final except where mistake, fraud, or misrepresentation is proven. Complaints, if any, must be tendered in writing to the Show committee. Cost of any resultant investigations shall be borne by the complainant if allegations are dismissed, or by the exhibitor against whom the complaint was issued, if allegations are proven correct.
- 16. All protests must be made within 24 hours of the show.
- Interference with or disrespect shown to the judge by any exhibitor during the performance of the judge's duties shall be deemed grounds for immediate disqualification.
- 18. Exhibitors must obey all rules of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc., and the North American International Livestock Exposition or be disqualified. Failure of exhibitors to follow the rules and release times shall result in the exhibitor not being allowed back the next year.
- 19. Exhibitor's timeslots for set up will be communicated to exhibitors.
- Unattended animals must be double-tied with halter rope plus neck rope or two halters, two ropes.

Show Rules

- 1. Entries can be made online at livestockexpo.org
- 2. All animals must be registered in the ABHA herd book and recorded in the name of the exhibitor 30 days prior to the NAILE registration deadline.
- 3. Cattle must be entered under the recorded ownership 30 days prior to show. Jointly owned animals must be entered under the multi-ownership (all co-owners) in the individual classes.
- 4. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must match registration papers. Any animal, upon check-in, that does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo) corresponding to the permanent identification on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.
- 5. Altering the conformation or natural appearance of the animal is prohibited. This includes covering of white skin and the use of artificial tailheads, switches, or any use of false hair. Other prohibited products include illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found in violation will be barred from showing.
- 6. Any winning animals in any and all divisions may be subject to DNA Parentage Verification (sire and dam only.) If discrepancies in parentage are found, the animal may be subject to forfeit its winning position and prize money/premiums.
- 7. All cattle must meet the health requirements set out by the NAILE Show Management. Any deviation will be just cause for immediate disqualification from the show.
- 1All bulls above one year of age must show with nose lead. The right to disqualify from the show any animal deemed unmanageable is reserved by the show committee.
- 9. Any person found guilty of misrepresentation by the Show and Sale Committee, including the age of animal, or not abiding by the show rules, will be disqualified and denied the privilege of show. Case may be referred to the ABHA for further action according to association procedure.
- 10. The registered owner and/or exhibitor must be a member in good standing with the ABHA.
- 11. Judges will have no preview of competing cattle or meeting with show exhibitors prior to the show. This is to maintain impartiality for all competitors and judge.
- 12. If for any reason an exhibitor or their animal is disqualified, their placing/winnings will go to the exhibitor that placed next behind them.
- 13. Classes are subject to change based on the number of entries.
- 14. Cow/Calf, and HX do not compete for overall champion female.

Breeding Show Classification

Cow/Calf Pairs (Any female older than the below ages with a calf at side.)

- All calves are to be less than 240 days of age on show day.
- One entry fee is required for pairs.
- If the calf is shown again on its own, an additional entry and fee is needed.

Show Rules

- Exhibitor must be at least seven years old and less than 22 years old by January 1, 2024 and a member of the American Black Hereford Junior Association (ABHJA). Dues are \$25 and must be paid prior to entry. Membership forms may be downloaded at blackhereford.org
- 2. All animals must be registered with the ABHA.
- 3. Horned, de-horned, or scurred animals are eligible to show.
- 4. Ownership Deadline is October 1, 2024. All animals must be registered and transferred prior to the October 1, 2024 ownership deadline date.
- 5. Late Entry deadline is October 15th. After that date, No late transfers or entries will be accepted. Entries with "pending" listed as the registration number will not be accepted, and entry will be refused. This includes calves showing on the sides of cows in the cow/calf pair show. Entry fees are non-refundable. Calves showing as part of a pair can be shown on their own, and a separate entry fee is due.
- 6. Cattle may begin arriving at 8 a.m. EST on November 14, and must be on the grounds and checked in by 4 p.m. EST on November 14, 2024. NO exceptions.
- 7. A hard copy registration certificate must be presented at check-in. Tattoos that are missing, illegible, altered, incorrect, and/or in any other way disagree with the official ABHA records will be justifiable cause for disqualification of entry. Check tattoos well before leaving for the ABHJA. ABHA Staff or designated individual can ask to check tattoos at any time.
- 8. Entries must meet Kentucky health regulations. All animals must have an official health certificate. Refer to Kentucky Health Requirements.
- 9. Exhibitor must show his/her own animals. Only exhibitors who are in attendance at the ABHJA and are physically unable to show the animals due to illness or injury will be excused. In the case of extenuating circumstances, the family must come to the ABHA board/staff, in which case, the board of directors/staff have sole discretion as to whether the animal may be shown by a substitute showman. Owner may secure another junior member to show his/her animals, if excused, or if exhibitor has more than one entry in the same class. It is recommended that if you have more than one animal being shown in a class you utilize a fellow junior from your own state to assist. No adult may assist exhibitor in showing.
- 10. The ABHA reserves the right for all class winners and runners-up to be subject to DNA testing to verify parentage.
- 11. It is a policy of the ABHJA board of directors that if an animal gets loose in the showing, an exhibitor will be given two chances to regain control of said animal throughout the duration of that particular show. After the third instance, exhibitor and animal will be dismissed from the showing by an ABHA board member or

ABHA staff member.

Animal Health

All Kentucky origin livestock must meet the exhibition requirements in 302 KAR 20:065, as listed below. For additional or updated information, contact the Office of the State Veterinarian at (502) 782-5901 or visit the website at: https://www.kyagr.com/statevet/animal-movement.html

Livestock exhibiting signs of any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease such as, but not limited to, warts, ringworm, pinkeye, or foot rot are not eligible for exhibition. All Kentucky origin animals for exhibition shall be individually identified on a certificate of veterinary inspection written within the current calendar year, January 1 through December 31.

- 4. All animals exhibited must have a DNA profile on file with the Braunvieh Association of America. A DNA sample on the subject animal must be received by the BAA or BAA representative prior to the show.
- 5. All animals exhibited must have a known Braunvieh dam or sire and are subject to DNA verification.
- 6. Animals may be Fullblood or Purebred to qualify for the FB/PB Braunvieh Show. Braunvieh Beef Builders will be shown in a separate beef builder show. Cattle recorded as "Braunvieh Influence" with a "BI" prefix are not eligible.
- 7. The BAA reserves the right to provide the judge and audience with the Expected Progeny Difference (EPDs) values, ultrasound data (collected by a certified technician), scrotal circumference for bulls, weights and ratios for performance, and weights with weight-per-day of age. Performance figures (including weights, hip heights, and frame scores), can be presented in their entirety or any combination deemed necessary by the BAA.
- 8. Heifers born on September 1, 2022, and after will show in the heifer show but can show with calves at side and still be eligible to show for champion female/heifer.
- 9. Heifers exhibited at 20 months of age or older (not females in cow/calf class) must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy by a licensed veterinarian or show with a calf at side, or for heifers used in embryo transfer, a certificate of positive fertility issued by a licensed veterinarian must be available for inspection.
- 10. Bulls exhibited at 14 months of age or older must have a positive semen test and a certificate to that effect. The certificate must be available for inspection. Bulls 12 months and older must show with a nose lead.
- 11. Altering animals' natural color will not be allowed; violation will result in disqualification.
- 12. No cosmetic surgeries other than surgical dehorning will be allowed; violation will result in disqualification.
- 13. Only generally accepted fitting practices will be allowed. Violation will be cause for disqualification. Show committee will make ruling on case by case basis. Animals disqualified will forfeit entry fees, awards, and show points. Appeals will be forwarded to ethics committee and Executive Vice President.

- 7. Bulls from classes 44,45,48,49 and 50 must have a valid, satisfactory semen test certificate in possession. This certificate is valid for the entire show season.
- 8. All animals shown in individual classes must be weaned, with the exception of the cow/calf class and calves at the side of females calved after September 1, 2022. Calves must be purebred and registered with the AICA. Females calved after September 1, 2022, must show in individual female classes appropriate to age. Nurse cows are not permitted.
- 9. All females 20 months and older exhibited at AICA-sanctioned shows must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.
- 10. 1AICA requires that all animals be shown with a halter and suggests that all bulls be shown with a nose lead.
- 11. All exhibits of Charolais breeding cattle shall be governed by the AICA by-laws, Article XV, titled Exhibition of Animals. The inspection of exhibit cattle is specified in Article XV, Paragraph C, of the association by-laws, and non-compliance of exhibit inspection is specified in Paragraph D of the same Article XV.
- 12. Article XV, Paragraph B, Point 2: "Each animal will be presented in its natural con-

formation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical, or other appearance change (including branding or other circulatory constriction) for cosmetic purpose, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming, or dehorning. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method per o s (by esophagus) is prohibited. Silicone injection or other injection for cosmetic purpose shall be prohibited. Anabolic steroid use shall likewise be prohibited, and any animal testing positive for anabolic steroid or diuretic use shall be presumed to be altered and modified."

- 13. The use of a coloring agent, flock, and powder is prohibited. Use of these products will result in the immediate disqualification of a given animal at such show.

Gelbvieh bulls must present exactly seventy-five percent (75.0%) to one hundred (100%) percent to qualify for and will show together in the Gelbvieh show. A Gelbvieh female or bull that presents exactly seventy-five percent (75.0) Gelbvieh or more and qualifies for the Balancer® trademark can choose whether to show as Gelbvieh or Balancer at the time of entry. Animals not meeting the minimum percentage qualification of seventy-five percent (75.0%) and do not qualify for the Balancer trademark will not be eligible to show. No changes can be made after entry deadline. To qualify for the Balancer® Show all cattle must meet the American Gelbvieh Association's Balancer trademark rules for registration as a Balancer Exhibitor must designate Gelbvieh or Balancer as breed on the entry form.
- 2. Proof of satisfactory semen evaluation for bulls twelve (12) months of age or older as of December 31 must be submitted at the time of check-in. Bulls over two years of age must have a semen evaluation certificate issued within 90 days of the show.
- 3. Cattle must be entered and exhibited under the recorded ownership at the time of the show entry deadline date. Jointly owned animals must be entered and shown under the multi-ownership (all co-owners) in the individual classes.
- 4. All animals must be properly tattooed, including herd prefix, and will be inspected at the show. - 6. Expected Progeny Difference (EPD) values will be provided to the judge and audience for all animals shown. Animals without EPD data are eligible to show, but will have N/A (not available) in place of missing data.
- 7. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be eligible to show.
- 8. All Hereford animals must be officially recorded (registered) thirty (30) days prior to show date to be eligible to show as a National Hereford Show
- 9. The individual classes will be made up and divided after the cattle are checked in at the show. They will be judged from the youngest class to the oldest within each class.

Show Rules

- All cattle, including calves on the side of dams must be registered in the Herd Book of the American Hereford Association (AHA). Entries with registrations "pending" or illegible tattoos, or improper tattoos as shown on the registration certificate at check-in time are ineligible for competition. Exhibitors are subject to the American Hereford Association special rule on class qualification. - 6. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be eligible to show.
- 7. All Hereford animals must be officially recorded (registered) thirty (30) days prior to show date to be eligible to show as a National Hereford Show

- 5. To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows, the North American Limousin Foundation reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include the following:
 - a. any use of paints, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders, or any other substances; all animals subject to white towel test;
 - b. The addition of any hair or hair-like substances, including false tail heads and false polls (false tail switches are allowed);
 - c. The cutting, tearing, or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal or the injection of any gas, solid, or liquid under the hide to alter the normal conformation;
 - d. Any products/solutions/liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is prohibited. This includes the use of steroids, growth stimulants, and the act of artificially fill ing animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method.

EXCEPTION: In the case of severely sick or severely dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered by the licensed official show veterinarian with the approval of the show superintendent or a NALF representative. That exception is not applicable on show day or weigh-in/check-in day.

- 6. All bulls older than one (1) year must show with a nose-lead. The Limousin show superintendent and the show management have the right to disqualify animals deemed unmanageable.
- Protests against exhibitors, individual animals, or fitting violations must be submit-7. ted in writing and signed by five (5) active members of NALF and presented to the show superintendent within 12 hours of the show's completion.
- 8. NALF reserves the right to mouth animals for dental development.
- NALF reserves the right to collect hair samples from any animal. 9.

a. To be eligible to exhibit in the Pre-Junior Show, the youth must be three (3) years of age but not eight (8) by day of show. To be eligible to exhibit in the Junior portion of the show, the youth must be eight years of age, but not yet 22 years of age on the day of the show.

b. Exhibitors must be current active members of the Miniature Hereford Breeders Association, either under family or junior membership.

c. Steers and heifers must be registered in the AHA and meet height restrictions in order to participate.

d. All steers must have a DNA profile on file with complete parentage verification (dam and sire verification) with the American Hereford Association before show entry deadline

e. The exhibitor listed on the entry will need to be the exhibitor for the show and showmanship.

- 9. Ownership

Exhibitor's name must be listed on the animal's registration certificate as owner or co-owner.

11. Fitting of Animal

Exhibitors are encouraged to help in any way that is safe and possible for them to do so, but not endanger either themselves, their animals, or others in the process. Exhibitors in the junior show are expected to participate in the fitting of their animals.

Alteration of conformation and structure by prohibited substance or unethical fitting is prohibited. Any violation of this rule will result in immediate disquali fication without recourse.

The injection, use, or administration of any drug that is prohibited by Federal, State, or Local Law or any drug that is used in a manner prohibited by Federal, State, or Local Law will result in immediate disqualification without recourse.

Any physical or physiological attempt to alter the natural musculature or weight by use of injections or ingested material not conducive to the continued health or marketability of beef carcasses or for deception will result in immediate disqualification without recourse.

Every participant, in consideration of their entry being accepted by the show, specifically represents that no animal entered is misrepresented in any way except trimming of feet and blocking of hair.

12. Official Weight and Height

The weight recorded at the time of check-in will be the official weight & height of the animal.

13. Check Weight and Height

The MHBA reserves the right, at its discretion, to check the weight and height of any animal.

14. Showing of Animals

Participants in this division are required to show their animal unless excused by show superintendent. Participants under the age of five will be required to have parental, sibling, or other participant accompaniment in the show ring.

Ownership Requirements

1. Open Show:

a. All animals entered will have at least one owner on record as a Regular or Junior Member of RAAA at the time of Regional or National Show's published check-in deadline.

b. Be Registered with RAAA and meet all requirements for Category 1A or 1B at the time of Regional or National Show's published entry deadline. (rev. 2/29/2019 BOD meeting.)

c. Have Official Registered Status at the time of Regional or National Show's published check-in deadline.

General Regulations

- Entries are accepted with the understanding that each exhibitor agrees to conform to the Rules and Regulations of the RAAA. Enforcement will be at the discretion of the RAAA authorized representatives and may include barring an animal or exhibitor.
- Exhibitors shall exhibit sportsmanship and professional behavior in and around the show ring. Abusive, discourteous, or threatening behavior toward judges, show officials, fellow exhibitors, or RAAA authorized representatives will not be tolerated.
- 3. All animals must have legible tattoos that match the Animal ID and Herd Prefix as

recorded in the RAAA database prior to processing.

4. Animal ID and Herd Prefix verification may be via printed registration certificate or real-time electronic representation of the RAAA database.

a. If the Animal ID and/or Herd Prefix are not legible and cannot be read during processing, the animal will be allowed to participate in the show; however, a fee of \$100 will be charged to the exhibitor for a DNA parentage test of said animal.

b. If the Animal ID and/or Herd Prefix are legible but are incorrect, the animal will not be allowed to show.

- 5. Each animal will be exhibited in its natural conformation and structure and without any alterations or modifications, with the exception of acceptable fitting and grooming practices.
- 6. The use of paints and/or the addition of any hair or hair-like substances will not be allowed.
- 7. At the time of processing, all females 20 months of age or older on the publicized date of show must have one of the following:
 - a. Certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian.

b. Written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist of having produced fertile eggs.

c. A female's own natural born calf at side, which need not be registered, but must be eligible for category 1A or 1B registration in the RAAA. Calf may not be an ET calf.

- 8. All bulls nine months of age or older on the publicized date of show must be shown with a nose lead.
- 9. After processing, should the number of entries in any class exceed practicality, authorized representatives of the RAAA have the authority to "split" classes according to age and at the date of birth that best encourages fair competition.
- 10. Any calf exhibited at the side of their dam in a cow/calf class may be exhibited in an individual class subject to all pertinent RAAA Show Rules and Classifications.
- 11. Any exhibitor who loses control of his/her animal twice in the show ring will be required to remove the animal from the ring.
- 12. No pumping will be permitted.

Declaration of Participation

Each exhibitor and/or owner of Red Angus entering in any Red Angus show or exhibition is subject to the following "Declaration of Participation" in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Red Angus Association of America.

- 1. "I/We, as exhibitor and/or owner of Red Angus, having made entry application to any Red Angus show or exhibition do hereby agree:
- "To make our cattle available to any tests or examinations called for by designated representatives of the Red Angus Association of America or show officials with regard to acceptability of the cattle to be exhibited in the show.
- 3. "To release the RAAA, its Board of Directors, staff, and authorized representatives from any claims for damages resulting from any such examinations or tests requested by authorized representatives of the Association or show officials."

4. "To retain the right to challenge the results of any such examination or test in due course and under the provisions of the Right to Appeal, in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Red Angus Association of America and incorporated in the SHOW REGULATIONS AND CLASSIFICATIONS."

Performance Information

Only official performance information processed by the Red Angus Association of America may be used in any show where performance data is utilized in arriving at a final placement or as an educational feature for spectators. All shows sponsored by the Red Angus Association of America must utilize official RAAA performance data as criteria utilized in judging.

Right to Appeal

- It is the explicit intent of the Red Angus Association of America to protect any and all exhibitors and/or owners of cattle entered in Red Angus shows from unethical and illegal standards; that the true course intended for the exhibition of Red Angus cattle be to show Red Angus cattle with desirable conformation and value as breeding cattle.
- It is also the explicit intent of the Red Angus Association of America that no exhibitor and/or owner of cattle entered in any Red Angus show be denied due process of appeal.
- 3. Should any exhibitor and/or owner of cattle entered in any Red Angus show feel the need to dispute or challenge either (a) the results of any examination of test administered to his/her animals as called for by any representative of the Red Angus Association or any show official, or (b) any decision made by any representative of the Red Angus Association or any show official as a result of any such examination or test, then the exhibitor has the right to make an appeal before the Executive Committee and/or the Board of Directors of the Red Angus Association of America. The exhibitor and/or owner is required to accept the decision of the Executive Committee and/or the Board of Directors of the Red Angus Association as final.

Protests

- 1. In the event of a protest, the individual making the protest will be required to make a deposit of \$300 to cover the cost of DNA or blood typing. If the protest is upheld, the deposit will be returned.
- All major livestock shows and/or expositions have a provision for submitting "protests." All exhibitors are urged to acquaint themselves with such provisions.
- 3. In the event a complaint should arise relative to the conduct, entry, or actual showing of an animal in any official Red Angus show under Red Angus Association sponsorship, such complaint must be set forth in writing and signed by the person initiating such complaint.
- 4. Further, such complaint, properly executed, must be delivered to the Executive Secretary within 10 days following the completed judging of the show. The Executive Secretary will present the formal complaint to the Board of Directors or the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors for their consideration and disposition.

Breeding Show Classifications

Only registered Red Angus (Category 1-A and 1-B) born on or after January 1, 2022, will be eligible for the 2024 North American International Livestock Exposition. Exception to maximum stated age will be in the cow/calf class. Calf entries in the cow/calf classes may be shown individually provided individual entry has been made.

Any animal not having a legible tattoo is ineligible to compete and will be barred from showing. All bulls over 12 months of age must be shown with a nose lead.

Entries are accepted with the understanding that the National Show Committee reserves the right to excuse any animal that arrives at the show and is not considered to be representative of the Red Poll Breed. All decisions shall be final.

Group Classes

Pair of Females – Two females, any age, must be owned by exhibitor.

Best Two Head –Any two animals, regardless of sex, any age, must be owned by exhibitor.

Junior Get-of-Sire - Three head, by the same sire, all three head must come from the

junior division or younger and must have competed in an individual class. Both sexes represented. Entries need not be owned by exhibitor.

Senior Get-of-Sire –Four head by the same sire with both sexes represented. All four head must have competed in an individual class. Entries need not be owned by exhibitor.

Premier Breeder Award - Banner

Cattle bred by one breeder are eligible for this award, regardless of exhibitor or owner at the time of show. The breeder receiving the most points after animals are exhibited in individual classes shall be the winner. Points are awarded as follows: 3 points for first, 2 points for second, 1 point for third. The John McKee Memorial Traveling Trophy will be awarded to the premier breeder.

Premier Exhibitor Award - Banner

Exhibitor is defined as one farm or ranch name in which the animals were entered under. Junior members, exhibiting with the farm or ranch may also be included under farm or ranch name for the purpose of Premier Exhibitor scoring with approval of the Show Committee. The exhibitor receiving the most points after animals are exhibited in individual classes shall be the winner. Points are awarded as follows: 3 points for first, 2 points for second, 1 point for third.

- 1. All animals exhibited must be recorded in the name of the exhibitor.
- 2. All animals must be registered in the American Salers Association (ASA) or the Salers Association of Canada. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must match the registration papers, which will be checked at the show. Only original registration papers from the ASA will be accepted when checking in cattle.
- Exhibitors are subject to all rules and health regulations of the American Salers Association and the North American International Livestock Exposition as set forth in this premium book.
- 4. The American Salers and Eastern States Salers will host two shows in conjunction with the Eastern National Salers Show. The Salers show will be for 87.5% Salers and higher bulls and females. The Optimizer section will be for 50% to 87.4% Salers bulls and females.
- 5. No exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors, or member owners shall be allowed to use any coloring agents on any animal exhibited. Division Champions and Reserve Division Champions will be checked by the "white towel" test prior to entering the championship line-up, if a protest has been filed.
- 6. No Premium Funds will be awarded.
- 7. The Eastern National Salers Show will follow the NAILE Protest Rule, General Rule #23.
- 8. Time of Judging: Judging times will be announced as nearly as possible in the tentative schedule of events. Exhibitors should ascertain at what time the exhibits entered will be judged. Any exhibit not presented promptly at the scheduled time will be barred from the competition in the class called. No complaint or protest will

Premiums

 The Kentucky Santa Gertrudis Association will pay premiums for their show. The association will determine the breakdown of premiums paid at a later date.

Special Rules

- All exhibits of Santa Gertrudis breeding cattle must be registered meeting the requirements for registration as outlined in the Santa Gertrudis Rules and Regulations for Registrations, and shall be governed by the last revised version of the Rules and Regulations for Approved Santa Gertrudis Open & Junior Shows as approved by the board of Santa Gertrudis Breeders International, PO Box 1257, Kingsville, Texas 78364. A copy may be obtained by contacting the association or may be viewed at www.santagertrudis.com.
- 2. Each owner must be a bona fide member of Santa Gertrudis Breeders International (SGBI). This means the active or junior member has paid all current dues and fees with no outstanding balances on their accounts.
- 3. ALL animals accepted for exhibition in an SGBI sanctioned show are subject to inspections at each show between arrival on grounds and prior to entering the show ring. The inspection will be conducted by a committee comprised of two (2) members of the Shows and Exhibits Committee and one (1) from the Breed Standards Committee.
- 4. Heifers twenty-four (24) months of age or older must be safe in calf as verified by a graduate veterinarian or have produced a live, Santa Gertrudis sired calf with that calf at side meeting the Standard of Excellence and the calf must be registered by thirty (30) days of age. All bulls twenty-four (24) months of age or older must provide a passing BSE test per show season.
- 5. All bulls 11 months or older must have a permanent nose ring.
- 6. Il animals must be registered or recorded and PERMANENTLY identified before the show with a brand ID or an ear tattoo.
- 7. FITTING

a. Purebred fitting - All purebred animals must be exhibited with the hair brushed down on the entire body, legs and tail with no foreign objects attached to the animal in a manner as to alter the animal's conformation or changes its appearance. Hair may not be trained upwards or forwards and/or pulled upwards or forwards on any part of the animal's body. Exhibitors failing to abide by this rule will not be allowed to show.

b. Specifically, all hair must be brushed down slick; head clipped smooth; underline clipped blending sides; udder and teats clipped with no long hair to emphasize udder; ears clipped as to environmental and local standards; neck and brisket clipped; body clipped using common sense as to season; leg hair clipped and do not leave long from hock or knee to hoof; tail head clipped; pull switch or brush out (no ball, etc.) trim tail to personal preference.

c. Star Five Fitting - Star 5 exhibits are not subject to purebred clipping rules. Entries are to be fitted as blow and go. Hair may be brushed according to pref erence with no paint or adhesives on any part of the body.

- 8. Each animal exhibited must be exhibited with the correct age and shown in the class corresponding with their correct age. SGBI reserves the right to tooth animals without prior notice to the breeders in order to verify age of cattle.
- 9. Entries in each class will be placed 1, 2, 3, etc. Animals are to be presented in descending order according to age.
- 10. Polled classes will be entered at the same time as class entries are required by each show. Animals will be lined up according to age for the judge.
- 11. To be eligible to show in Best of Polled, animals to be slick polled with no scurs, no scars, no dehorning, and with no evidence of horny tissue.
- 12. There must be at least five (5) exhibitors and twenty-five (25) head of cattle or a minimum of fifty (50) head of cattle to constitute a recognized Santa Gertrudis Show.
- 13. In all shows in which fifty (50) head or less are entered, all early and late classes may be combined at the discretion of the show officials.
- 14. Classes with over thirty (30) entries should be divided into sections and section winners return for final placing.
- 15. The judge must be an SGBI approved judge.
- 16. Dress for exhibitors participating in an SGBI show shall be of clean and neat clothing of collared shirts with sleeves, belts, no midriffs showing, and appropriate footwear (no tennis shoes). Exhibitors may wear hats or go bareheaded; no caps.
- 17. Juniors showing in open shows are allowed and encouraged. Entry must be shown by the owner or immediate family member (sister, brother, mother, father, grandparents, legal guardian). No animal may be fitted or shown by an open exhibitor at any time during the junior's ownership period. An exception is transportation, feed, and care to a show may be allowed. Refer to junior ownership rules.
- 18. Each animal shall be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical, pharmaceutical, or other appearance change, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming, or dehorning. Additionally, no pumping or filling of an animal with a liquid, diuretic, or any other substance is allowed. All animals and exhibitors found to be in violation of this rule will be banned for life from showing at SGBI approved shows.
- 19. If entries are not properly fitted and good herdsmanship followed, the owner may be asked to not display their cattle until adhering to the proper procedures as outlined in our herdsmanship papers.
- 20. Every exhibitor, in consideration of his/her entry being accepted, agrees to submit any animal so entered by him/her to inspection and agrees to have such animal submitted to any tests as may be designated and requested by the Shows and Exhibits Committee, or the authorized representatives of the relevant show or fair, and agrees that the conclusions reached by the committee/representative as to whether such animal is unethically fitted or over age, shall be final, without recourse, against SGBI and designated personnel. Any false representation, interference, or unprofessional conduct on the part of any exhibitor will be dealt with by the Shows and Exhibits Committee according to the equities of the case.
- 21. Any person who furnished the birthday of the animal to SGBI either on the IPRA or some other document (whereby that birthday information is transferred to the

registration certificate) and that animal is exhibited in an SGBI approved show with an incorrect age and the age determined by the SGBI designated veterinarian exceeds the age listed on the registration certificate by more than 30 days, the person furnishing the birthday above and such person furnishing said information to SGBI for inclusion on the registration certificate shall be barred from showing in an SGBI approved show for a period of six (6) months for the first offense, one year for the second offense and for life for the third offense. However, the animal, if transferred to another owner, may be placed in the correct class and be shown again.

- 22. For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in any SGBI approved show, each exhibitor hereby releases SGBI, its officers, directors, and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits and judgment either past, present, or future, arising from or connected with the administration or use of such test or examination and the resulting decision therefrom.
- 23. Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any test, exam, or show rule enforcement, as applied to his/her animals, shall do so in accordance with procedures established by the rules of the association.
- 24. Appeals:

a. The Chairman of the Shows and Exhibits Committee and the Vice Presi dent of Youth Activities, in conjunction with the person(s) responsible for coordinating the individual shows, will continue to be primarily vested with authority to determine whether animals entered in shows meet the standards formally approved by the Breed Standards Committee.

b. In the event the Vice President of Youth Activities or individual show coor dinating official disqualifies an animal from participating in a sanctioned show, and the exhibitor wants to appeal the disqualification, the appeal process out lined below must be followed.

c. In the event the Chairman of Shows and Exhibits or individual show coordinating official disqualifies an animal from participating in a show, and the exhibitor wants to appeal the disqualification, the appeal process outlined below must be followed.

d.Additionally, any exhibitor participating in an individual youth show or other SGBI sanctioned show that wants to appeal a breed standards disqualification decision by either the Vice President for Youth Activities/youth show coordinating official of the Chairman of Shows and Exhibits/show coordinating of ficial must follow the appeals process outline below.

Appeals Committee:

The appeals committee will be comprised of the following three (3) mem bers – the Vice President of Breed Improvement, the Vice President of Marketing and Promotions, and the Executive Director of SGBI. All three (3) members must be present to constitute a quorum. All decisions rendered by the Appeals Committee will be binding and final for all appeals submitted to the committee.

Appeals Procedure:

a. All qualification/disqualification appeals and appropriate supporting docu mentation submitted by exhibitors must be submitted in writing to the Execu tive Director of SGBI. The written appeal must be accompanied by a \$200

process fee. No waivers will be granted to the requirements for written appeals and the upfront \$200 fee.

b. Exhibitors must file written appeals postmarked or via e-mail within five (5) business days following the date of the show governing the qualification/dis qualification decision by the primary officials (Vice President of Youth Activi ties/show coordinating official or Chairman of Shows and Exhibits/event coor dinating official).

c. The Executive Director will be responsible for coordinating meetings of the Appeals Committee and forwarding copies of the appeal and supporting docu mentation to the other committee members.

d. The Appeals Committee will render a final decision within five (5) business days following receipt of the written appeal, appropriate supporting documen tation, and the \$200 fee.

e. In the event an exhibitor appeals a disqualification decision by the primary officials and the Appeals Committee approves the exhibitor's appeal, the animal covered by the appeal will be qualified to participate in all future SGBI sanctioned events.

f. In the event an exhibitor appeals a disqualification decision by the primary official and the Appeals Committee disapproves the exhibitor's appeal, the animal covered by the appeal will be disqualified from participating in future SGBI sanctioned events. Additionally, any points or awards previously given to the owner of the animal will be forfeited.

g. In the event an exhibitor appeals a qualification decision by the primary official and the Appeals Committee rules that the animal covered by the appeal does not meet breed standards, the covered animal will be disqualified from participating in future shows, and the owner of the animal will forfeit any points and awards previously granted.

27. Procedures to File Protests:

a. File protest with show that infraction occurred. Follow their protest rules.

b. File the same protest with the Shows and Exhibits Committee. Contact the chairman.

c. Three exhibitors must sign the protest.

d. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100, cash or certified check, which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Shows and Exhibits Committee within 24 hours after the occa sion for such protests.

e. Order of hearing a protest:

- i. Chairman of Shows and Exhibits Committee
- ii. Action by Shows and Exhibits Committee

iii. Final action by Board of Directors

iv. Follow appeal procedure as outlined in Rules and Regulations. f. All rules and regulations that have been properly protested to the Shows and Exhibits Committee shall be subject to the following penalties:

i. Loss of Premium Money

ii. Loss of Awards

iii. Suspension from showing the subject animal as deemed necessary. Penalty may be for one (1) show, two (2) shows or three (3) shows, or as long as deemed necessary for the offense.iv. Suspension of the exhibitor being the same as other SGBI Rules and penalties.

- 28. Failure to adhere to each show's specific rules shall also be subject to these penalties. Proper protest procedures must be adhered to according to that particular show's rules. SGBI will follow each show's rules, and any action taken by a show will be upheld by SGBI in relation to its bearing on our point show system.
- 29. Disqualifications: An exhibitor who has been disqualified from competition in any livestock show or has had a premium withheld or withdrawn on the grounds of rule violation(s) will not be allowed to compete in other shows. This shall include, but is not limited to, disqualification for fraud, misrepresentation, unethical fitting, or deception. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation, and depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed. No complaint or appeal that a judge overlooked an animal will be considered. If any exhibitor, in any way, whether in person or by their representative, interferes with the judge(s) or shows any disrespect to them or to show officials, the existing show may excuse him/her from the ring and exclude him/her from further competition; exhibitor premiums that may have been awarded may also be withheld. If an animal is disqualified after having won awards or premiums, the animals placing below him may be moved up (at the option of the Shows and Exhibits Committee) to fill the vacated position.
- 30. Conduct in the Show Ring: If any exhibitor/owner/showman interferes in any way with the judge or shows disrespect to him/her, or to the show in the ring, the exhibitor/owner/showman may be dismissed by the judge or show management from the ring. The management may withhold from each exhibitor/owner/showman any premium monies that may have been awarded or take other steps deemed desirable.
- 31. DNA Tests On Questionable Animals: Santa Gertrudis Breeders International and its representatives reserve the right to require any test deemed necessary to verify the accuracy of an entry, classification, and/or the pedigree of exhibited Santa Gertrudis animals, including calves exhibited at the side of a Santa Gertrudis female.

- All animals must be registered in the American Wagyu Association herd book and recorded in the name of the exhibitor 30 days prior to the NAILE. Exhibitors must have a registration certificate for each animal available for inspection at the show. There will be six breeding group class shows: Fullblood Black, Fullblood Red, Fullblood Red/Black, Purebred Wagyu, Percentage Wagyu, and a Steer Class. For the purpose of this show, Wagyu percentage means animals that qualify for the percentage category according to the AWA rules. Breeding group classes will not compete with each other.
- 2. Cattle must be entered under the recorded ownership at the time of the show entry deadline. Jointly owned animals must be entered under the multi-ownership (co-owners) in the individual classes.
- 3. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoo must be legible and must match registration papers. Any animal, upon check-in, that does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks, or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be retattooed and rechecked at the show.
- 4. Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, use of false tail heads, or use of any false hair. The use of paint, glue, graphite, powders, hemp, or other similar substances used externally is also prohibited. Animals may not be dyed on the show grounds. Other prohibited products include illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.
- 5. Winning animals in all divisions may be subject to DNA Parentage Verification (sire and dam only). If the parentage cannot be verified by the lab, the exhibitor will not be awarded the prize money and the animal will forfeit its winning position.
- 6. All cattle must meet the health requirements set out by the NAILE Show Management. Any deviation will be just cause for immediate disqualification from the show.
- 7. All bulls must show with nose lead. The right to disqualify from the show any animal deemed unmanageable, is reserved by the show committee.
- 8. All females shown in the cow/calf classes must be shown with a calf at side. Calf at side must be her last natural born calf (not an embryo calf born to another recipient.)
- Any person found guilty of misrepresentation of any kind, including age of animal or not abiding by the show rules, will be disqualified and denied the privilege of showing.
- 10. The registered owner/exhibitor must be a member in good standing with the Ameri-

can Wagyu Association.

- 11. Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein, including barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.
- 12. Judges will have no previews of competing cattle or meetings with show exhibitors prior to the show. This is to maintain impartiality for all competitors and judges. Violations of the rule will result in disqualification of judge, competitors, and/or animals.
- 13. If for any reason an exhibitor or their animal is disqualified, their placing/winnings will go to the exhibitor who placed next behind them.
- 14. There will be a Junior Showmanship Division. Novice (8yrs to 18yrs NEVER SHOWN BEFORE), Juniors (8-10 years), Intermediates (11-14 years), and Seniors (15-18 years). No bulls will be allowed for safety reasons. Cattle used in showman-ship classes do not need to be owned by exhibitor but do need to be properly fitted and entered in the NAILE American Wagyu Association Show competing in at least one sanctioned class in the current year. Judging is solely on the exhibitor's ability to show the animal to the best of their ability. Additional ring stewards will be added for these classes for safety reasons. - All sheep pens will be assigned and tagged by NAILE staff.

Health Information

- Health Inspections will be conducted prior to entry onto the fairgrounds at the V Lot left of Gate 1 on Phillips Lane.
- All animals must have a valid Health Paper with Official USDA Identification (including all transit animals).
- After Health Paper inspection all animals must enter at Gate 1.
- Gate 1 will be open 24/7.
- All Beef Cattle will be required to have a USDA 840 EID tag. This includes all transit and sale cattle.
- All cattle shall be reported negative on a BVD-PI test that has been collected by an accredited veterinarian. The results and date of the test shall be recorded on the CVI issued for entry into the KEC facility for NAILE.
- All Swine will be required to have a USDA 840 EID tag.
- All Sheep and Goats will be required to have a Scrapie Tag.
- Health Regulations are subject to change at any time, so please check with your local veterinarian or the office listed below for current requirements.

- 1. All sheep in purebred classes shall be registered with their respective breed association with the corresponding tag or tattoo listed on that animal's registration paper. Ear tag or ear tattoo, if required by the respective breed association, may be checked in at the show ring before final placing. Judges will be instructed to check mouths of sheep and take weight and size for age in consideration before making their final placing.
- All original registration papers for each entry in the sheep show shall be presented to the North American officials at check-in prior to showing. In special circum-

stances, fax copies will be accepted, but are required to have originated from the breed registry office, and shall include both front and back of registration paper. NO SWITCHING OR SUBSTITUTING OUT OF CLASS WILL BE ALLOWED AT CHECK-IN; all animals are required to show in class they were entered. Animal substitutions within same class are allowed. There will be no changes on entries after check-in and back tags are issued.

- 3. Not more than three individual entries in any one ram class, nor more than three in any one ewe class (unless class is split) will be accepted, except those Sale Sheep required to show in order to sell. Exhibitor is limited to one entry in each group class.
- 4. Limit of awards: Livestock exhibitors will not be awarded more than two premiums in any one class and one premium in any one group class. Ribbons shall be presented in the order of placing by the judges. However, third money will be paid to fourth winner, fourth money to fifth winner, etc., when the third winner is prohibited from receiving the third cash award under the provisions of this rule.
- 5. Only sheep entered in the shows or sales will be permitted to be penned in the sheep barn. All other sheep shall be kept in trailers or horse barns and are not the responsibility of NAILE.
- An animal will only be allowed to exhibit in one breed classification show regardless if it has papers and is eligible for more than one show.
- 7. All animals shall be entered and exhibited under the registered name appearing on the records of the breed association. This includes all group classes and premier exhibitor. Jointly owned animals shall be entered and shown under the multiownership names appearing on the breed association records and can show in group classes and receive premier exhibitor points with animals of the same ownership.
- 8. All exhibitors are expected to dress neatly.
- 9. No muzzles will be allowed on breeding sheep.
- 10. Sheep in the show will be subject to vet check by a competent veterinarian before entering the barn. No sheep are allowed to show with visible signs of prolapse. All sheep will be monitored for lamb fungus, and any animal with fungus will be dismissed.
- 11. Sale sheep are released after their sale. Are required to get releases from sale office.
- 12. Curtains in the exhibitor's pen areas cannot be more than 48 inches high. Also, no aisles are to be roped off denying access to the public.
- 13. Anyone removing livestock from the grounds without show management approval (release form) is subject to forfeiture of all premium money. Repeat violators will be subject to further action by the Executive Committee. (Read General Rules #10, 11, and 34.) Early release shall be approved by NAILE staff prior to arrival.
- 14. Dogs will not be permitted on the grounds of the Kentucky Exposition Center during the course of the NAILE show, except those under leash control of the owner. Any dog running free will be impounded and removed from the grounds.
- 15. Lambing in the sheep barns is prohibited.
- 16. Exhibitors are required to check in with the sheep department's staff to verify entries and receive class numbers. This process will close at 12:00 noon the day before the breed is to be shown unless showing on Thursday. Animals showing on Thursday will need to be checked in by noon on Tuesday. Any exhibitor not checking in by this deadline or individual entries verified by this deadline will have those entries struck from the respective show.
- 17. Numbers will be issued for each individual animal entered, and the appropriate number is required to be worn in the corresponding class.
- 18. All Ewe and Ram Breed Champions are required to parade for Supreme Champion.

Premiums and awards will be forfeited if champion is not presented.

- 19. All of the rules and regulations listed in the front of this catalog also apply to the Sheep Department.
- 20. All early release requests shall be approved by NAILE management prior to November 1 of the current year.
- 21. Premier Exhibitor Scoring

Premier Exhibitor - Computed from winnings: 10 points for first place; 9 points for second place; 8 points for third place; 7 points for fourth place; 6 points for fifth place; 5 points for sixth place; 4 points for seventh place; 3 points for eighth place; 2 points for ninth place; and 1 point for tenth place. Points will be computed from all individual classes and will be awarded only to the registered name appearing on the records of the breed association. Animals do not have to be bred by Exhibitor. Only the two highest placing individuals in any one class will be counted. Only the eight highest placing animals will be counted. No group classes will be counted with the exception of the flock class, which will only be used to break ties.

The Board of Directors of the USSA made and passed a motion that this \$10.00 entry fee shall be paid prior to the show in Louisville to the USSA office by November 1, 2024. Entry fees may be paid the night before the show at the USSA booth, but will be assessed an additional \$10.00 penalty. Breeders who have not paid their fees in the past, or who have not paid their fees in advance of the 2024 show, will be prohibited from participating in the event. Junior exhibitors entering the open show are also required to pay the additional \$10.00 per head entry fee.

All entries in the show <u>are required to have a private flock tag and/or tattoo in the</u> <u>sheep's ear which corresponds with the private flock number with the animal's</u> <u>official certificate of registration</u> as recorded with the United Suffolk Sheep Associations.

All United Suffolk Sheep Association policies apply to all exhibitors and all animals exhibited in the North American International Suffolk Show.

In the Slick Shorn Division, all sheep are required to be slick shorn over the entire body. No patch shearing allowed.

All class entries will receive premiums based on a sliding scale. Exhibitors with more that two entries in a class will receive premium for only the top two places. Classes with more than 15 entries will be split, with each class receiving premiums according to the sliding scale.

In order to ensure compliance, blood samples will be drawn from the following animals after the show: 1) Grand champion ram and ewe, 2) Reserve grand champion ram and ewe, 3) Senior and Junior Champion Ewe and Ram, 4) Reserve Senior and Reserve Junior Champion Ewe and Ram, and 4) Any animal whose placing and individual class has been randomly selected for testing prior to the show. For a complete copy of the show policy, please contact the Association office.

- Age limit for junior exhibitors shall be 21 years old or under on January 1 of this year. There is no lower age limit for junior exhibitors, but each exhibitor is required to be physically capable of controlling and showing their own sheep (handicapped excepted).
- Junior exhibitors are required to be present to show their own animal unless physically impaired. If the exhibitor has two entries in the same class, another junior exhibitor is required to show one. If one animal is a futurity animal, the owner is required to show it to be awarded futurity points for that class.
- 3. All Southdowns are required to be slick shorn within five days of the show. Wool may be left below the knees and hocks on the legs. Also, wool may be left on the forehead up to the scurs, and wool may be left on the ears.
- 4. All animals are required to have permanent flock identification, either a legible tattoo or ear tag, that corresponds with the registration certificate. Sheep not having this identification will not be allowed to show.
- 5. Sheep are required to be registered and recorded with the American Southdown Association by the date listed by each show for proper ownership. Sheep are required to be registered in the junior exhibitor's name. Sheep registered in farm, family, club names, etc., will not be eligible to show in junior shows. All sheep will show in their respective age classes according to their date of birth as recorded on their registration papers. Partnership-owned animals will be accepted provided all partners meet junior exhibitor requirements. A partnership animal can only be shown under one of the partner's names at any one show and cannot be switched at that show between partners.
- 6. When two people show one animal, the registered owner of the animal is required to be in control of the head at all times. The youth assisting in the ring is required to be within the age requirements posted by the National Junior Southdown Association.
- 7. All Southdown breeding sheep will be shown with all four feet on the ring surface, except for setting the feet.

8. To qualify for Bred and Owned, dam must be registered in name of the exhibitor or sibling group at the time of breeding. The animal being exhibited must be registered in exhibitor's name at time of show. Any questions or disputes will be evaluated by show management and board members present.

- Speckled face, ears or legs
- Horns
- White hooves
- Intentional alteration of hair color or skin pigmentation
- Total pink pigmentation of nostrils
- Black lambs
- Surgical alteration other than re-docking

- 4. Open to both ewes and wethers. Ewes cannot be shown in the junior breeding show.

- 4. Entrants chosen by sponsors to participate in this class are required to have a sheep background or sheep interest. The entrant will be judged on the mode of clothing selected, which is required to be attractive and lend elegance to the class. The garment is required to be made of a minimum of 70% wool. Entrants are required to furnish their own garment.
- 5. Judging Standards: (600 points total)

If two or more are entered in the same class, another junior is required to show one of them. Any exception is required to be in writing and approved by the Superintendent by 8:00 a.m. the day of the show.
- 9. The premium money will be prorated. Ten places will be paid in each class.
- 10. The top five wether lambs will be selected from the breed Champions and Reserves. After selection, Grand and Reserve Grand will become property of NAILE.

- 16. The wethers will be shown in classes by weight and by breed. All wethers are required to have a lower weight limit of 95 pounds, actual weight at re-weigh, with no upper weight limit. Show Management reserves the right to adjust class numbers and breaks as needed with a maximum of 35 classes total. Hair sheep wethers will have a minimum weight of 75 pounds.
- 17. Blackface crossbred will be broken into a minimum of three divisions, light, medium, and heavyweight. The Division Champions will then compete for Blackface Cross Champion.
- 18. A minimum of 15 entries are required to be checked in for any one breed to be eligible for a separate breed show. Breeds with fewer than 15 head will go into the All Other Breeds class.
- 19. Only two premiums per owner will be awarded in any one class.
- 20. Exhibitors are allowed to enter eight total animals commercial ewes and market wethers combined. However, each exhibitor is limited to entering or showing a maximum of six (6) wethers in the Junior Market Wether Show.
- 21. All wethers will be released after the show on Sunday, November 17, 2024 except the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion. There will be no carcass contest. All wethers are required to be removed from the barn on Sunday November 17, 2024.
- 22. Attention: There are plans for a market to sell your lambs on Sunday, November 17, 2024. If you sell your lambs, the checks will be issued at the time of loading.
- 23. The top five market wethers will be drug tested. Random animals may also be selected for drug testing. At time of testing, Animal Affidavit Forms will be available to provide information of any medication given that the animal could test positive for. For additional rules and information, please refer to the National Code of Show Ring Ethics in the General Rules starting on page xvii.
- 24. All Grand and Reserve Champion animals will be processed, and the carcasses and hides of each animal will be inspected and evaluated for tampering. This would include but is not limited to inspection of the carcass and hide for injection sites that do not conform to typical animal husbandry practices. Any animal with an abnormal carcass or hide due to the injection of air or any other substance in order to alter the

conformation or appearance of an animal may be subject to disqualification including loss of premiums, prizes, and awards received. Exhibitors may also be banned from future competition.

The Richard Roe Memorial Award

The family and friends of Richard L. Roe will present the Richard Roe Memorial Award to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Junior Wether. Mr. Roe was the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Market Lamb in the first North American International Livestock Sheep Show. The cup is to be in the possession of the breeder who wins it for one year at a time, and his/her name is to be engraved upon it. The cup is to be returned to the North American International Livestock Exposition in time for the show again the next year.

Dorset

The Continental Dorset Club (CDC) will award \$500 to the Champion Dorset Wether and \$250 to the Reserve Champion Dorset Wether in accordance with the requirements being met of the Continental Dorset Club Wether Incentive Program. Complete requirements of the program are posted on the CDC website at: dorsets.homestead.com. Winning wethers are required to be registered with the CDC prior to show date and be in the individual exhibitor's name. No post show registration applications will be accepted. The exhibitor is required to be a youth member of the CDC, and no ewe lambs are eligible. The original registration certificate is required to be presented to the CDC official present immediately following the show for identification and ownership verification on the lamb.

Hampshire

The American Hampshire Sheep Association, P.O. Box 231, 305 Lincoln St., Wamego, KS 66547, offers \$50.00 to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Wether, if sired by a registered Hampshire Ram. The sire's association number and a picture of the Grand Champion shall be submitted within 60 days to the AHSA office to receive this award.

Montadale

The Montadale Sheep Breeders' Association, Inc., 32649 W. 171st Court, Gardner, KS 66030, offers \$50.00 to the exhibitor of the Champion Montadale Wether (or the highest placing Montadale if Montadales are shown in the AOB class). A photo of the wether, together with the sire and dam registration numbers, shall be submitted to the association office within 60 days to receive these awards.

Oxford

The American Oxford Sheep Association (9305 Zollman Rd, Marysville, IN 47141) offers an additional premium of \$75.00 to the exhibitor of the champion Oxford Wether if it is a purebred Oxford. The premium will be paid from the American Oxford Sheep Association office. A photo of the wether and exhibitor, the name of the breeder, and the registration numbers of both the sire and the dam shall be submitted to the association office within 60 days following the show to receive this premium.

Shropshire

- All entries and awards in this department will be subject to the NAILE General Rules and Regulations published in the Premium Book and also to the following rules.
- 2. Entries: The show shall be open to all exhibitors. There is a limit of four animals that can be entered in an individual class by an exhibitor and only two premiums per class per exhibitor.
- 3. Eligibility of Animals: All goats must be registered in the Herd Book of the American Boer Goat Association. The original registration certificate is required.
- 4. Tattoos: All goats must have legible tattoo(s) or other means of permanent identification consistent with its registration certificate, or the animal will be disqualified. The top five in the classes plus the Champion & Reserve must have their tattoos read and recorded. If the animal has a microchip as its permanent identification, the exhibitor is responsible for providing a microchip reader.
- Computing Ages: Birth dates, as listed on the registration certificate, will be used to determine the class divisions. AGE IS CALCULATED AS OF THE DAY OF THE SHOW.
- 6. Classes: All animals must be registered purebred, fullblood, or percentage blood boer goats. Percentage doe classes are for goats 25% or less than 93.75% boer; fullblood classes are for does that are 15/16 blood (93.75%) and higher; and 31/32 blood (96.8%) and higher for bucks. Progeny of fresh does will not be allowed in the ring. The Champion and Reserve classes will be chosen from the first and second place animals in that division of the show.
- 7. Disqualification: Any goat showing any pronounced defect or abnormality will be barred from the show in any of the breeding classes. Artificial coloring will result in a disqualification. Illegible tattoos or tattoos inconsistent with registration papers will result in disqualification. Any doe over 24 months of age that has not kidded and cannot prove a current pregnancy will not be allowed to show.
- 8. Substitutions are allowed in the same class only and must have the same ownership as the original entry. Please make substitutions at check-in.
- 9. Exhibitors will receive an entry number for each goat entered and must wear the correct number in the show ring.
- 10. Parking, Admissions, and Camping: See information in front of this Premium Book.
- 11. All feed and bedding must be provided by the exhibitor. It can be brought from home or purchased at the show. The furnishing of feed and bedding to other exhibitors is not allowed.
- 12. All goats in the barn must be entered in the show.

- 1. Exhibitors must be in good standing and current members of the Junior American Boer Goat Association (JABGA).
- 2. Animals owned and exhibited by JABGA members will receive JABGA Ennoblement Points. JABGA exhibitors who are eligible to receive ennoblement points on their entries will be awarded them based on the animal's final placing.
- 3. If the child is present and physically able, they must show their own animal unless they have multiple entries, then they must have another JABGA member show the animal for them.
- 4. If the child is physically unable or not present due to specific circumstances approved by the Youth Committee or involving a death in the family, family emergencies, or religious reasons, they must have a Junior member show for them, and it must be reported to the ABGA Youth Coordinator before the goats arrive at the show.
- 5. JABGA members under the age of twelve (12), as of January 1, or members with physical or mental disabilities are allowed to have a heeler in the class, but the member must help in the presentation of the animal. The heeler must be eligible to show in accordance with age and membership requirements.
- All animals must be owned or transferred into the Junior Exhibitor's name by October 8 of the current year. All goats must be registered in sole name of the Junior Exhibitor. No ranch or family name may be listed in the owner section of the certificate.
- 7. All show results received by JABGA will be final.
- All ABGA rules, breed standards, classes, judges, and entries apply. All JABGA sanctioned shows are required to have a BRED AND OWNED CLASS, with one class each for the PERCENTAGE DOES, FULLBLOOD DOES, AND FULL-BLOOD BUCKS. All ages will compete in one class.
- 9. JABGA reserves the right to not sanction and/or to not tabulate placings for points submitted by a show or not yet submitted by a show that didn't follow ABGA rules, breed standards, classes, judges, and entries.
- 10. JABGA strongly suggests that JABGA members own and care for his/her own goats. Directors and members of JABGA discourage unethical ownership and care.
- 11. 1Exhibitors and parents should always conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner. Infractions of this rule may cause immediate termination of membership by a majority vote of the Board of Directors.
- 12. Judges for JABGA sanctioned shows are required to be an ABGA Approved Judge. Judges' names must be published sixty (60) days prior to the show.

- 7. Junior exhibitors must be present to show their own Junior entries unless physically impaired. If two or more are entered in the same class, another junior must show one of them. Any exception must be in writing and approved by NAILE management by 8:00 a.m. the day of the show.
- 8. Only two premiums per owner will be awarded in any one class.
- 9. Each exhibitor is limited to entering and showing a maximum of six (6) market goats.
- 10. The premium money will be prorated. Ten places will be paid in each class.
- 11. A weight card obtained when the market goat is checked in must be filled out and turned in via QR Code Submission for each goat by 2:00 p.m. Wednesday, November 20, 2024. The weight indicated on the card will be the declared show weight of the market goat. Scales will be available for the exhibitor's use until show time. By signing the weight card, the exhibitor/owner agrees to all NAILE rules and regula-

tions, including ownership and code of ethics. All violations will be reviewed by the Exposition management and/or the Executive Committee. No building of legs, flanks, and any other area on any market goat. Refer to Rule 5 of the National Code of Show Ring Ethics. Exhibitors may use collars, collars with a short lead, or halters when showing.

- 12. All market goats will need to submit weights via QR Code by 2:00 p.m. Wednesday, November 20, 2024.
- 13. There will be no changing of weight after the weight cards have been turned in.
- 14. After each class of market goats is placed, minimum of top three market goats will be weighed on the official scales in the show ring by show officials. If any market goat is more than five pounds above its declared show weight, it will be disqualified and the remaining market goats will move up in placing. The disqualified market goat is not eligible for any other class and will not be reweighed.
- 15. The market goats will be shown in classes by weight. All market goats must have a lower weight limit of 50 pounds, actual weight at re-weigh, with no upper weight limit. Show Management reserves the right to adjust the class numbers and breaks as needed, with a maximum of 35 classes total.
- 16. All wether goats are to be castrated with no testicular tissue present.
- 17. Market classes will be divided evenly into five divisions. Champion and Reserve in each division will compete for Grand and Reserve Champion Market Goat.
- 18. All market goats must have scrapie tag in place and match health certificate.
- 19. Market Goats will be entered using a USDA Scrapie Tag number. All Market Goats will be required to have a scrapie tag in place at the time of show. The Scrapie Tag must match health papers and msut match what is submitted via QR Code for entry.
- 20. The top five market goats will be drug tested. Random animals may also be selected for drug testing. At time of testing, Animal Affidavit Forms will be available to provide information of any medication given that the animal could test positive for. For additional rules and information, please refer to the National Code of Show Ring Ethics in the General Rules starting on page xvii.
- 21. The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Market Goat will become the property of NAILE after selection. All Grand and Reserve Grand Champion animals will be processed and the carcasses and hides of each animal will be inspected and evaluated for tampering. This would include, but is not limited to, inspection of the carcass and hide for injection sites that do not conform to typical animal husbandry practices. Any animal with an abnormal carcass or hide due to the injection of air or any other substance in order to alter the conformation or appearance of an animal may be subject to disqualification including loss of premiums, prizes, and awards received. Exhibitors may also be banned from future competition.

- All Swine will be required to have a USDA 840 EID tag. Including all transit animals.

- All Sheep and Goats will be required to have a Scrapie Tag.

Special Rules

- To be eligible to exhibit in purebred classes of the National Junior Market Swine Show, exhibitors must not be more than 21 years of age as of January 1 and must be members of the National Junior Swine Association (NJSA) or Team Purebred Junior Association. (For membership information, contact the NJSA at (765) 463-3594 or Team Purebred Junior Association, (405) 641-9042. Crossbred exhibitors have the same age requirements.
- 2. All junior show animals are required to be owned by and must be exhibited by the youth in whose name the entry is made, except in the case of more than one entry per class. If an exhibitor has more than one entry in a class, it must be shown by another junior exhibitor. An exception to this rule (in case of emergency) must be approved by 8:00 a.m. on the show day by the superintendent. Purebred and crossbred entries may be purchased females or market hogs, but must be owned by the junior exhibitor, the exhibitor's family name, or exhibitor's farm name, 60 days prior to the date of show, or by the specified ownership deadline. Registration papers must have been transferred to or registered in the name of the junior exhibitor, the exhibitor's farm name, by October 8, 2024.

All youth exhibitors from 8 to 19 years of age must be certified in the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals, YQCA (or a state's equivalent Quality As surance Program that has been approved by the National Pork Board). Youth exhibitors 20 years of age or older must be certified in the Adult PQA, as they are not eligible to be certified in the Youth YQCA. Youth exhibitors less than eight years of age cannot be certified in the Youth YQCA, but will be allowed to participate if their parent or legal guardian is certified in the Adult PQA. All youth exhibitors must provide their YQCA or PQA number with entries. For youth exhibitors from 8 to 20 years of age, a farm certification card will

not suffice.

Youth exhibitors who need to obtain certification in the YQCA can be certified through a face-to-face meeting conducted by their YQCA Advisor, or they can be certified online by visiting the National Pork Board's website at http://www.yqcaprogram.org or http://www.pork.org. State equivalences accepted.

- 3. Entries for all classes will close on October 8, 2024 with original entry fee price. Late deadline for entries will close October 15, 2024.
- All purebred entries must be ear-notched, with notches matching the registration papers. (All swine entered in special breed classes will be checked at check-in by NSR/NJSA and Team Purebred personnel).
- 5. The show is open to either barrows or gilts. Breed will be determined at check-in.
- 6. Gilts may only show in either the Breeding Gilt or the Market Hog show. They may be entered in both but may only show in one. Gilts only entered in the Breeding Gilt Show cannot be transferred to the Market Hog Show. Gilts only entered in the Market Hog Show cannot be transferred to the Breeding Gilt Show.
- Exhibitors will have access to the showgrounds no earlier than Wednesday, November 6, 2024. Any exhibitor upon whom this rule would work a hardship may apply to the manager of the North American International Livestock Exposition for special consideration.
- 8. Special breed classes will be provided for Berkshire, Chester White, Duroc, Hampshire, Hereford, Landrace, Poland, Spotted, Tamworth, and Yorkshire. Those breeds with less than 15 head checked-in will have their premiums reduced by 50%. Purebred market hog classes will be broken by weight with approximately 25 head per class, depending on the number of entries. A Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected for each breed and these animals will be eligible for the Grand Champion Drive.

a. All NJSA market hog entries must be registered Berkshire, Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace, or Yorkshire market animals. All Team Purebred market hog entries must be registered Chester White, Hereford, Poland China, Spotted, or Tamworth market animals.

b. All animals are to be guaranteed negative of the stress gene to be exhibited at an NSR or NJSA event. All Chester White hogs are to be stress negative to be exhibited at a Team Purebred event. Berkshire market hogs must have negative stress status denoted (HAL-1843*nm under the pig's name) on the pedigree. Blood samples will be collected on all Berkshire market hog breed show champions, reserve champions, and any randomly chosen animals to determine compliance with ABA negative stress gene policy, parentage, and breed purity.

c. NSR and NJSA reserve the right to randomly collect a DNA profile on exhibited animals for stress gene, parentage identification, and breed purity at any event where registered animals are exhibited. This collection will be supervised by NSR and NJSA representatives. The collection of samples from Chester Whites, Hereford, Poland China, Spotted and Tamworth market hogs will be supervised by Team Purebred or CPS representatives.

d. All breed champions, reserve champions, and/or any randomly selected market hogs may be blood tested for presence of the stress gene, parentage verification, and breed purity through DNA technology.

e. Champion and Reserve Champion overall premiums as well as breed champion and reserve breed champion premiums will not be awarded until the DNA results are verified at the NSR office.

f. Any market hogs that fail these DNA tests for the stress gene, parentage

verification, or breed purity will be asked to forfeit all show premiums and awards. If premiums and awards are not returned to NSR, the exhibitor will not be allowed to compete in future NJSA or NSR events.

g. Market hogs must meet all registration eligibility requirements of their respective breed associations. NSR field staff or a qualified NSR representative will inspect all market hogs for breed eligibility.

- 9. Owners will furnish all feed for hogs. An official supplier will be available for the purchase of feed and bedding.
- 10. The North American International Livestock Exposition will not be responsible for losses, injuries, or mishaps that may befall animals during the show. All reasonable precautions will be taken to prevent losses or injuries.
- 11. The Executive Committee will interpret all rules not covered in the general rules. (See the NAILE General Rules and Regulations).
- 12. All premiums will be paid directly to the exhibitor from the NAILE office.
- 13. Each exhibitor will be allowed six (6) entries, but money will be paid on only two (2) entries per class, if earned.
- 14. Top five market hogs will be selected from the Breed Champion and Reserves.

- 15. Grand and Reserve Grand Champion will become the property of NAILE following selection. All Grand and Reserve Grand Champion animals will be processed, and the carcasses and hides of each animal will be inspected and evaluated for tampering. This would include but is not limited to inspection of the carcass and hide for injection sites that do not conform to typical animal husbandry practices. Any animal with an abnormal carcass or hide due to the injection of air or any other substance in order to alter the conformation or appearance of an animal may be subject to disqualification, including loss of premiums, prizes, and awards received. Exhibitors may also be banned from future competition.
- 16. All animals being sold after the market hog show are subject to selection for use in the NAILE livestock judging contests. Exhibitors will be notified by show management if their animal was selected. Animals will go to market at completion of livestock judging contests.
- 17. Exhibitors will declare weights on market hog entries. The following is the process that will be used to declare weights:

a. Upon arrival at NAILE, exhibitors will pick up a backtag for each of their entries. Weights will be submitted via QR Code on the backtag. b. Practice scales will be available for exhibitors to use to determine the weight of their market hog. The weight the exhibitor will declare for their market hog must be submitted through the QR Code. All declared weights must be within the range of 230 to 290 pounds. (THERE WILL BE ABSOLUTELY NO VARIATION FROM THIS WEIGHT RANGE.) All entries will be divided into equal sized classes based on declared weights with approximately 25 animals in each class.

- 18. A hog buyer will be available if you wish to sell your hogs. Purchase price will be announced at the show.
- 19. As each class of market hogs is placed, at least the top three (3) placing market hogs will be weighed on official scales by show management before a final placing for the class is determined. Each market hog must be within 15 pounds above or below its declared weight. If any market hog is out of its weight range, it will be disqualified from the show. The disqualified pig is not eligible for any other on-foot class and will not be reweighed.
- 20. The top five animals will be drug tested. Random animals may also be selected for drug testing. At time of testing, Animal Affidavit Forms will be available to provide information of any medication given that the animal could test positive for. For additional rules and information, please refer to the National Code of Show Ring Ethics in the General Rules starting on page xvii.
- 21. The crossbred classes will be split into three (3) divisions, Light, Medium and Heavy. Rosettes will be awarded to Division Champions and Reserve Champions. Division Champions and Reserves will compete for Champion and Reserve Crossbred, who will then move on to compete with Breed Champions and Reserves for Grand and Reserve Champion Overall.

Special Rules

- 1. Entries and all fees are to be submitted to NAILE by October 8, 2024. Late entries and fees are required to be submitted by October 15, 2024.
- 2. To be eligible to exhibit in purebred classes, exhibitors must not be more than 21 years of age as of January 1 of the current year and must be a member of the National Junior Swine Association (NJSA) or Team Purebred Junior Association.
- 3. All junior show animals are required to be owned by and exhibited by the youth in whose name the entry is made, except in the case of more than one entry per class. If an exhibitor has more than one entry in a class, it is required to be shown by another junior exhibitor. An exception to this rule (in case of emergency) is required to be approved by 8:00 a.m. on the show day by the Superintendent.
- 4. Purebred and crossbred entries may be purchased females or market hogs, but must be owned by the junior exhibitor, the exhibitor's family name, or exhibitor's farm name, 60 days prior to the date of show, or by the specified ownership deadline.
- 5. All purebred entries must be ear notched, with notches matching the registration papers. (All purebred animals will be checked in by NSR/NJSA and Team Purebred personnel.)
- 6. Exhibitors will have access to the showgrounds no earlier than Wednesday, November 6, 2024. Any exhibitor for whom this rule would pose a hardship may apply for special consideration from the NAILE office.
- Special breed classes will be provided for Berkshire, Chester White, Duroc, Hampshire, Hereford, Landrace, Poland, Spotted, Tamworth, and Yorkshire. Those breeds with less than 15 head checked-in will have their premiums reduced by 50%.
- 8. Purebred classes will be broken by age, with approximately 25 animals in each class, depending on the number of entries. A champion and reserve animal will be chosen in each breed, and each of those animals will be eligible for the Grand Champion Drive.

b. All animals are to be guaranteed negative of the stress gene to be exhibited at an NSR or NJSA event. All Chester White hogs are to be stress negative to be exhibited at a Team Purebred event. Blood samples will be collected on all Berkshire breed show champions, reserve champions, and any randomly chosen animals to determine compliance with ABA negative stress gene policy, parentage, and breed purity.

c. NSR and NJSA reserve the right to randomly collect a DNA profile on exhibited animals for stress gene, parentage identification, and breed purity

NAILE Open Sale Rules and Regulations

- 1. All the rules of the Open Swine Show and this premium book apply.
- 2. Sale Order: Sale order will be determined after the Show by the Sale Committee.
- The judge and Sale Committee shall determine which animals must sell. Exhibitors
 will be notified after the gilt show of gilts selected for the NAILE Open Sale. If
 selected, the exhibitor's gilt must go through the sale. NO SUBSTITUTIONS
 ALLOWED.
- 4. New for 2024* 1st and 2nd from each class will be eligible to sell. Exhibitors must notify the Sale Committee by the end of the show if they would like to participate in the sale.
- 5. Sale commission is 15% for all animals. This amount will be deducted from payment amounts made to sellers. Any and all buyers must pay the full bid price.
- 6. If an animal is selected and cataloged for the sale by the Sale Committee and the animal does not go through the sale ring, the exhibitor will be banned from exhibiting at the North American International Livestock Exposition for three (3) years and will be charged a 20% commission fee of the average sale price. The exception to this rule is if the official Show Veterinarian provides a written statement releasing the gilt from going through the sale due to injury or illness. The veterinary statement must be provided to the Swine Show Superintendent no later than 1:00 p.m. on the day of the sale.
- 7. NAILE acts only as the agent between the buyer and the seller. If proper payment is made by the buyer in a timely manner, the Breed Associations will make settlement with the seller within thirty (30) days of payment received.
- 8. The Show Veterinarian will be available to provide necessary vet inspection papers and other required health documents. The vet fees become the responsibility of the buyer.
- 9. After the successful sale of an animal, the new owner becomes responsible for the care, management, and removal of said animal. All animals must be removed from the grounds at the conclusion of the Market Hog Show, Sunday November 10, 2024.
- 10. All buyers must be registered with the sale clerk. All payments must be made in full on the day of the sale, or animals will not be released to the buyer. All gilts must have an official release before leaving the grounds. Terms are cash, check, or credit card (Visa, Master Card, or Discover only). Checks and credit cards require a valid and current driver's license. Credit card transactions are subject to a 4% credit card transaction fee. Any buybacks made by the exhibitor will pay commission only, not the full sale price.
- 11. All sale exhibitors with animals selected for the sale must attend a mandatory sale meeting following the Gilt Show. The meeting will be held at the Swine Show Ring, and the start time will be announced immediately following the Gilt Show.
